## Background

On September 17, 2001, Attorney General John Ashcroft issued an anti-terrorism directive that tasked each United States Attorney with coordinating operations of the Anti-Terrorism Task Force (later renamed the Anti-Terrorism Advisory Council (ATAC)) within each district. The responsibilities of the United States Attorney and the ATAC Coordinator in each United States Attorney's Office (USAO) include the following: (1) convening and establishing the agenda for council meetings; (2) ensuring that the participating federal, state, and local agencies work in a coordinated fashion and freely share information; (3) developing a consensus among council members about investigative and prosecutive priorities and strategy: (4) collaborating with the Counterterrorism Section (CTS) Regional Coordinators about priorities and strategy; and (5) ensuring that the member agencies maintain a long-term focus on anti-terrorism.

A recent report on the Department of Justice's Terrorism Task Forces by the Office of the Inspector General (OIG) acknowledges the important contributions of the ATACs toward achieving the Department's goal of preventing terrorism and promoting national security, credits the ATACs with helping to strengthen the Department's infrastructure devoted to counterterrorism and assisting in the development of a national network of representatives from federal, state, and local agencies, and private industry.

We thank you for your participation in our ATAC over the past 4 years and your contribution in helping us to achieve these goals. We would like to build on this initial success by continuing to improve the ATAC program in this district. Your responses to the attached survey will help us to determine whether the ATAC in this district is operating effectively; and how we can improve our ATAC so that it provides you with the information and training that you need to successfully perform your jobs.
