(U//FOKO) Details:

(U//FOCO) On 04/21/2013, after the Boston Marathon bombing, the TP Orlando Resident Agency (ORA) received an immediate lead regarding Todashev. The lead referenced telephonic contact between Todashev and Boston Marathon bombing suspect Tamerlan Tsarnaev. TP ORA TFO along with another TP ORA FBI Agent conducted an interview of Todashev on 04/21/2013. The interview was initially conducted at Todashev's residence and then was moved to the OPD. The purpose of this interview was to identify the nature of the relationship between Todashev and Tsarnaev. During the interview, Todashev stated he had trained as a Mixed Martial Arts (MMA) fighter with Tsarnaev in Boston. Todashev voluntarily provided his DNA and signed consent to search forms for his computer and five cellular telephones. On 04/23/2013, TP ORA initiated a Full Investigation (FI) on Todashev.

(U//FOUG) Todashev was a certified MMA fighter in both Florida and Massachusetts with a prior history of assault which was known to TP, \_\_\_\_\_\_ and the MSP Troopers. He held a Florida State Boxing Commission license, number FED#: 129-225 with an expiration date of 08/08/2017, and a State of Florida, Department of Business and Professional Regulation,

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MMA Participant, license number PART4184, with an expiration date of 12/31/2012. In addition. Todashev held a Massachusetts - Department of Public Safety State Athletic Commission MMA Amateur License, number: A3105, with an expiration date of 07/18/2012. Information obtained from local law enforcement reports and a National Crime Information Center (NCIC) report documented Todashev's prior alleged involvement in violent interactions. Specifically, in a Boston Police Department (PD) report of an incident on 02/11/2010, Todashev was charged with Disorderly Person. Resisting Arrest, Reckless Driving, and Weaving. In an Osceola County Sheriff's Office (SO) statement dated 07/07/2012, Todashev was mentioned as a participant with another individual, in a Simple Battery incident involving the attack on an employee of the Ali Baba Hookah Café. Todashev was not arrested or charged in this incident. Most recently, an Orange County SO Incident Report of an incident on 05/04/2013, stated Todashev was arrested for Aggravated Battery (causing bodily harm or disability to another), a Second Degree Felony. In addition, MMA fights involving Todashev were posted on YouTube and had been observed by TP, Agent and the MSP Troopers.

(U//FOKQ) Through BS's investigation, additional information was obtained indicating Todashev's possible involvement in a triple homicide in Waltham, Massachusetts on 09/11/2011. Based on this information, BS requested a second interview which was conducted by TFO along with another TP ORA FBI Agent. Agent and Trooper observed the interview which was conducted at the OPD on 05/16/2013. The interview strategy focused on establishing Todashev's timeline in the Boston area in September 2011 and his association with Tsarnaev. During the interview, Todashev provided information which indicated his presence in the Boston area on about 09/10/2011, as well as further clarification on his contacts. Todashev also mentioned a tentative plan to leave the country, however no date was provided.

(U/APOGO) It was during this interview that TP contacted

(U/POUD) After the interview, TP obtained information indicating Todashev had tentative travel plans to return to Russia on 05/24/2013. Due to Todashev's possible departure from the U.S., CTD requested another interview for the purpose of solidifying Todashev's timeline in the Boston area in September 2011 and to subsequently confront Todashev with forensic evidence associated with the homicides. On 05/21/2013, TFO arranged an interview with Todashev for later that evening at OPD. While preparing for the interview, Agent and Troopers and learned Todashev did not want to meet at the OPD during his prior interview with the FBI. However, due to Todashev agreed to meet at his apartment. Todashev's residence was an apartment with a standalone address of Orlando, Florida. Agent supervisor had been briefed the interview would take place at OPD. TFO supervisor was also briefed the interview would take place at OPD; however, was subsequently informed the interview location changed to Todashev's residence.

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(U//FOUC) For the 05/21/2013 Todashev interview, no operational or arrest plan was documented and there was no plan in place to arrest Todashev. In addition, no communications plan was established to provide operational updates to the appropriate FBI personnel on the progress of the interview.

(U//FOEC) While making arrangements for the interview and due to the change in venue, Troopers and briefly discussed recording Todashev's interview. Both Troopers mentioned the recording devices they both possessed. On the way to the interview, the MSP Troopers, Agent and TFO briefly discussed whether Florida was a one or two party consent state. No decision was made to record the interview. SIRT later determined Florida is a two party consent state with a law enforcement exception.

(U//FOUC) On 05/21/2013, at approximately 7:35 p.m., TFO Agent and Troopers and met in the parking lot of Todashev's residence with Todashev and his friend Todashev led the MSP Troopers and Agent into his apartment while TFO who had no involvement in the Waltham homicide investigations, remained outside of the apartment with Todashev's friend Prior to entering Todashev's apartment, the law enforcement officer's observed an image of an AK-47 at the top of Todashev's front door. TFO provided perimeter security for the duration of the interview.

(U//FOUG) TP had surveillance coverage on Todashev on the evening of 05/21/2013, from 4 p.m. to midnight. The surveillance team was in the vicinity of Todashev's residence throughout the evening and spot checked Todashev's parking lot for a specific vehicle associated with Todashev. At approximately 7:45 p.m., two unknown males (TFO and were observed in Todashev's parking lot near said vehicle. At approximately 11 p.m., the vehicle departed the parking lot and traveled to a gas station before returning to the same parking lot. Surveillance was terminated at midnight.

(U/**POUC**) Todashev's residence was a two-level apartment with a separate entrance. The ground floor consisted of two rooms, a living room and a kitchen separated by a counter which permitted viewing from one room into the other. A small hallway next to the kitchen connected the apartment entrance to the living room. A sliding glass door was located at the rear of the living room which provided access to a common area behind the residence. A single stairway in the living room led to the upstairs loft and bathroom. Hanging on the stairwell wall in the living room was a metal sword. The approximate overall inner dimensions for the ground floor were 14'5" by 32'2".

(U//FOGO) Upon entering the apartment, Agent took a seat, on the second stair step which led up to the loft. Trooper sat in a folding chair in the living room and Trooper stood against the stairwell wall, also in the living room. Todashev sat on the floor next to a bed located in the corner of the living room, adjacent to the sliding glass door. This was directly across from Trooper and to Agent front left. Trooper and Agent

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(U//F) Shortly after entering Todashev's apartment, unbeknownst to the others, Trooper turned on his small portable MSP audio recording device concealed in his left breast pocket. The interview began almost immediately and Todashev was described as calm, articulate, and not excited or agitated. Approximately 20 minutes into the interview, Trooper remembered he had a personal JVC digital recorder in his bag. He decided to turn it on and placed it on the table after he deleted some of his family videos to make room to record the interview. This was also done unbeknownst to the others. As Todashev talked, Trooper continued to check the recorder and had to delete additional family videos on two occasions to make more room to record. The first portion of the interview was also deleted in order to ensure there was enough room to record once the conversation focused on the Waltham murders.

(U//FOHG) Throughout the duration of the interview, Todashev was free to move around his apartment and allowed to smoke cigarettes, open and close the sliding glass door for ventilation, and take both water and restroom breaks. Approximately two hours into the interview, the questioning transitioned from Todashev's timeline in Boston and his contacts to his involvement with the triple homicide.

(U//**EOUO**)

It was at this point, at approximately 10:25 p.m., when Trooper provided Todashev with his Miranda warning. Trooper verbally provided the warning to Todashev and had him sign the Miranda warning form (FD-395). This was captured via Trooper personal JVC digital recorder. Todashev waved his rights and continued to answer questions. At approximately the same time, Todashev's friend provided TFO with Todashev's cellular telephone and wallet and left the area. TFO texted the MSP Troopers he had possession of Todashev's property. Trooper exited the residence to retrieve the property from TFO and then returned to the interview.

(U/**TOKO**) During the interview, Trooper provided updates to Middlesex Assistant District Attorney (ADA) At approximately 10:30 p.m., ADA headed into his office in anticipation of drafting an indictment based on the information provided by Trooper

(U/DOCO) A short time after Todashev signed the Miranda warning, the JVC battery failed and Trooper used his personal cellular telephone to continue recording the interview.

 Todashev noticed Trooper
 recording with his

 cellular telephone and requested it be turned off. Trooper
 complied. A short time later,

 Trooper
 placed his personal cellular telephone on the dining room table and resumed recording.

(U//EOCO) The recordings, both via Trooper personal JVC digital recorder and b6 his personal cellular telephone, captured Todashev's description of both Tsarnaev's and b7C Todashev's participation in the triple homicide. In summary,

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(U//FOHO) Once the questioning focused on his presence in the Boston area during the time of the Waltham homicides Todashev's demeanor changed. Todashev began to chain smoke, repeatedly glanced around the room, appeared fidgety, and looked as if he was stretching his arms and legs as he spoke.
(U// DUC) With the sliding glass door open in the room, Todashev sat on the bed andAtb6approximately 11:55 p.m., Trooper informed Trooper and Agent heb7cwas going to step outside for a few minutes. Trooper then stepped outside in order to callb7a
(U// Agent moved from his position on the stairs to Trooper seat on the folding chair in front of the white table, approximately six to seven feet from Todashev. Trooper stayed standing in his original location next to the stairwell wall. As seen on Trooper cellular telephone video recording, Todashev began to smoke and drink water as he scanned the room. Todashev asked for more cigarettes even though a nearly full pack was on the table in front of him. Trooper believed Todashev was attempting to get him to leave the room.
(U//EOCO)       Trooper       b6         turned off his personal cell phone recording device in order to use his phone and review his       b7C         messages.       Trooper       heard Todashev ask Agent
Agent responded stating, Shortly afterward, Todashev asked to go to the restroom.
(U// FOUG) For safety purposes, just like prior trips to the restroom, Trooper and Agent accompanied Todashev upstairs to the restroom. Agent was at the top of the stairs and Trooper was standing on the stairs about halfway up where he could maintain visual contact. Both were alert due to Todashev's deliberate behavior as Todashev was moving extremely slow, looking around, and did not appear to have to use the bathroom. Trooper and Agent made eye contact and gestured to one another to be aware
of the threat Todashev posed. (U// EOGO) When Todashev finished in the restroom, Trooper proceeded down b6
the stairs first, followed by Todashev, and then by Agent Due to Todashev's UNCLASSIFIED//FOR OFFICIAL USE ONLY

noticeable change in behavior, Trooper became concerned Todashev might try to flee or attack them. Trooper previously observed Todashev looking around at the metal sword and described Todashev as moving extremely slowly as if he was calculating in his mind. As Trooper turned toward the main room, he grabbed the sword which was hanging on the wall, and as a safety precaution, quickly placed the sword behind a shoe rack next to the kitchen entrance. Although Todashev was still on the stairs, Trooper believed Todashev saw him hide the sword due to his reflection in a large mirror positioned at the bottom of the stairway. This mirror appeared to be strategically placed to view the hallway leading to the front door from the stairs. Based on Trooper training and experience, he was alert and felt the need to remove the sword hanging on the apartment wall as Todashev's demeanor had changed.

(U//EOCO) Todashev returned to his position sitting on the bed	ь6
Agent returned to sit in the	b7C
folding chair directly in front of the white table and Todashev. Trooper changed position	b7A
and sat on the stairs, while Trooper remained outside.	

(U//POCO) Due to Todashev's continued methodical behavior, Trooper sent a text message at 12:03 a.m. on 05/22/2013 to Agent and Trooper which read: "Be on guard. He is in vulnerable position to do something bad. Be on guard now. I see him looking around at times." Trooper was on his cell phone at the time and was unaware of the incoming text message. Trooper waited for Agen BlackBerry to "ding" to signify the receipt of the text message. After about a minute, Trooper still did not hear the "ding" so he looked down to check his cell phone to make sure the text went through.

(U//ECC) Almost immediately at 12:04 a.m., while Agent was reading his notepad and Trooper was looking at his phone for the text message. heard a loud noise and felt a blow to the back of his head. Trooper Suddenly, Agent was looking at his personal cell phone when he heard what he described as a roaring noise and looked up to see the table between Todashev and Agent flving toward Agent Todashev had flipped the table he was writing on, and Trooper believed it had struck Agent in the head. Trooper immediately velled to alert Trooper there was trouble inside the residence. Agent (Trooper who was knocked partially off his chair, saw Todashev run past him towards the kitchen and tried to grab Todashev's legs but missed. Agent then stood up, drew his weapon, and gave verbal commands more than once to Todashev, to include, "show me your hands!" Agent bserved Trooper to his left but was focused on Todashev and not aware if Trooper had drawn his weapon.

(U// Agent stood in the middle of the living room and saw Todashev in the kitchen and described what he heard as the sound of metal banging together like knives in a hurried fashion. Agent continued to give verbal commands for Todashev to show his hands, but Todashev did not comply. Agent believed Todashev had retrieved some type of weapon. Trooper then observed Todashev run toward the front door near the kitchen area and began quickly scanning left to right as if looking for something. Trooper thought Todashev was trying to flee and stepped towards him. As Todashev reached the

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front door he grabbed a red pole, approximately five-feet long, which was leaning against the described Todashev's movements as incredibly quick, wall near the front door. Trooper "like something in a movie." As he grabbed the pole, Todashev turned quickly, ran at full speed from the entryway directly toward Trooper and Agent Agent saw Todashev's left shoulder drop as he came through the entryway toward the living room where he were standing. Again knowing of Todashev's prior arrests and status as a and Trooper MMA fighter, Agent noted that it was obvious to him that Todashev was in an attack posture. Trooper saw Todashev raise the pole above his head with both hands in a fighting position, and charge toward Trooper Trooper raised his arms in front of his face to protect himself and stated he believed Todashev was, "going to impale me with the pole."

(U//FOCO) In the split second available to assess the threat posed by Todashev, Agent was in fear for his life and the life of Trooper In order to stop this threat. shot Todashev with two volleys of three to four shots per volley. Trooper Agent heard the shots fired from the first volley off to his right and saw Todashev make two twisting movements with his torso which indicated he had been impacted by the shots. Both and Agent observed Todashev fall and almost immediately re-Trooper establish his footing, suddenly lunging towards them at an angle. Still in fear for his and the MSP Trooper's life, Agent shot Todashev with a second volley of three or four shots in order to stop the threat. Trooper heard the shots and saw Todashev fall to the ground, face first. At that time. both Agent and Trooper believed the threat had been eliminated. Agent fired seven shots in total using his Bureau issued Glock 23, all of which hit Todashev with the fatal shots entering his head and heart.

 (U/EDEC)
 Immediately after the second volley of shots, Trooper
 heard Agent

 yell "call 911." Trooper
 turned to look toward Agent
 and saw he

 was bleeding profusely from his head. Trooper
 applied pressure to a large laceration near

 the back of Agent
 head.

(U//FOKO) Trooper who was still outside on his cell phone with ADA heard noise coming from inside the residence followed by several gunshots. Trooper did not notice anyone else outside, dropped his notes, and drew his weapon. Trooper followed by TFO announced himself, and came through the front door of the apartment which was not locked. When Trooper entered the apartment, he saw Todashev lying on the floor. It was apparent to Trooper due to the multiple gunshots and lack of movement, that Todashev was dead.

(U//DSCO) Immediately after entry into the apartment, Trooper saw Agent bleeding from the head profusely. Trooper applied pressure to Agent wound while Trooper checked Todashev. Trooper used a rubber medical glove and checked Todashev for a carotid and ulnar pulse. Trooper was unable to locate a pulse at either location and Todashev's eyes were open and unblinking. Trooper believed Todashev was deceased and did not move his body further to keep from disturbing the scene.

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(U//FDG) After entry, TFO stepped back out of the doorway and called Emergency Medical Services at approximately 12:07 a.m. The Orlando Fire Department responded and after arriving on-scene pronounced Todashev dead. Agent and Trooper were taken to the hospital where Agent was treated for a large gash on his head which required nine staples. Trooper sustained no injuries other than a temporary hearing impairment in his right ear due to the sound produced by the gunshots.

(U/POO) The SIRT was initially not aware of the audio and video recordings taken during the interview of Todashev on 05/21/2013. On 06/05/2013, Agent \_\_\_\_\_\_\_advised the SIRT of the existence of the recordings obtained by the MSP Troopers during the interview of Todashev. On 06/06/2013, the SIRT obtained the Todashev audio and video interview recordings from the MSP. Three recording devices were used by the MSP Troopers at various times during the interview. In total, the devices captured four recorded video segments, three with audio, and one without. The recordings captured various portions of the interview and confession of Todashev; however, none captured the shooting incident. Florida is a two-party consent state with a law enforcement exception. Therefore, the MSP Troopers, as law enforcement officers, were within authority to record Todashev without his consent. The Department of Justice (DOJ), Civil Rights Division concurs with this analysis and reviewed the audio and video recordings.

(U// DOKEQ) On 06/13/2013, the SIRT re-interviewed Troopers and regarding the use of the recording devices.

(U//FOUC) On 07/24/2013. Inspector Assistant Inspector and DOJ Civil Rights Attorney travelled to Orlando and met with Chief Medical Examiner and Medical Examiner (ME) to discuss the Autopsy Report of Todashev. Todashev was shot seven times and the entry and exit points of each bullet and angles of impact were fully discussed. Most importantly, the shots to Todashev's body were angled indicating a twisting, bending, or turning of the body at the time of entry. The shots included three to the left upper side of Todashev's torso, two to the middle right side of his back, one to the top left shoulder, and one to the left side of the crown of his head. Based on the wounds and the internal path of the bullets, it is likely Todashev was moving throughout the incident. advised the trajectory of the bullets through the body indicated the shooter was to the left of Todashev. In addition, the results of the autopsy were consistent with Todashev falling forward toward the shooter with head down. and also indicated the shot to the head was likely one of the final shots as it was incapacitating.

(U/DOCQ) advised the trajectory of the head and shoulder wounds, the combination of the seven entrance wounds to include the paths of the bullets, were inconsistent with other possible scenarios. First, due to the extreme downward trajectory of the wounds to the head ("A") and upper shoulder ("B"), these wounds were inconsistent with the shooter being behind Todashev as if Todashev was running away. Rather, those extreme downward trajectories could have occurred when Todashev had his back to the shooter, only if: 1.) Todashev leaned backwards at a severe angle toward the shooter; or 2.) Todashev was standing

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below a shooter who was above him; or 3.) Todashev was shot while both he and the shooter were prone on the floor.

(U/FOUG) On 07/25/2013, a meeting was held with A/USA Ninth Judicial Circuit of Florida, State Attorney Jeffrey Ashton, and the State Attorney's Office Investigator A full briefing of the shooting incident was provided by Inspector and disks/binders of the SIRT investigation were provided. The State Attorney expressed concern about backlash from the public once the ME Report was released, as it described shots to Todashev's back and advised he would conduct an independent review of the shooting. The State Attorney requested to re-interview the MSP Troopers and audio record those interviews.

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(U4705Q) The MSP Troopers were re-interviewed on 09/06/2013 by the State Attorney Investigator These re-interviews did not provide any new substantive information. Observers to the interview included: MSP Command Staff, DOJ Civil Rights Division Attorney FBI Inspector and Assistant Inspector

(U/4FOUG) At the time of the SIRT, based on information provided by OPD, a decision not to conduct a neighborhood canvass. Upon further was made by Inspector discussion and review by FBIHQ Inspection Division, DOJ Civil Rights Division, and the State Attorney, a decision was made to conduct interviews despite the time period that had lapsed. On 12/04/2013. Assistant Inspector with the assistance of a TP ORA Agent conducted a neighborhood canvass of the residences surrounding Orlando, Florida, 32819. Seventeen residences were approached, of which occupants of three residences described hearing shots fired around midnight. Of the three, one resident observed the lights on, the sliding glass door blinds open, and several males inside Todashev's residence. The resident thought this was odd, because the blinds were never open. At approximately 12:00 a.m. on 05/22/2013, this resident heard four loud pops, followed by three additional pops. Although he/she could not see where the noise came from, he/she believed the individuals across the lake were doing construction, and looked out the window and observed several individuals "hovering" over something on the ground. This resident advised he/she did not call the police to report what was heard because he/she thought the noise was attributed to construction.

(U//**EOU**) Todashev was described as:



Geeslin who was acting on behalf of A/SAC to arrange logistics prior to arriving in TP ORA. On 05/22/2013, the SIRT traveled to TP ORA and upon arriving, IIC and the SIRT members went directly to the scene of the incident, Orlando, Florida. Upon arriving, the SIRT was greeted by ASAC Robert C. Geeslin, TP ERT Coordinator BS SSA and MSP Detective Lieutenant The SIRT was briefed by ASAC Geeslin and TP ERT Coordinator The SIRT observed the scene through the front and rear door of the Todashev's residence as TP ERT described the scene. (U//EOUG) FBI Deadly Force Policy Training was conducted on 10/23/2012 during legal training provided to the BS personnel. BS SSA Chief Division Counsel, advised SSA or SSA Associate Division Counsel were the presenters of this training, which was memorialized via Electronic Communication dated 01/17/2013. A review of the attendance records conducted by SSA indicated Agent was present for the training conducted on 10/23/2012.

#### F. (U//FOKO) Use Of Body Armor and Law Enforcement Identifiers:

(U//E) As the Agent and MSP Troopers were conducting an interview of Todashev and not participating in a planned law enforcement action, none of them were wearing identifiable ballistic body armor, nor were FBI or law enforcement identifiers displayed. However, all personnel verbally identified themselves as FBI and law enforcement officers to Todashev upon their initial arrival at his residence for the interview.

## G. (U//F**DKO**) <u>Criminal History</u>:

(U//FOFO) The NCIC criminal history check contained two entries for Todashev which documented two arrests for offenses including aggravated battery, disorderly conduct, and resisting arrest. At the time of the NCIC query on 05/23/2013, no active arrest warrants were located for Todashev.

(U//FOR) In addition, three police reports were obtained for Todashev. A Boston PD incident report on Todashev referenced a traffic altercation on 02/11/2010 in which Todashev was charged with Disorderly Person, Resisting Arrest, Reckless Driving, and Weaving. An Osceola County SO incident report on Todashev referenced an assault at the Ali Baba Hookah Bar on 07/07/2012. Although not arrested or charged by the SO, Todashev was associated with another individua who was charged and arrested for Tampering with a

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Victim by Threat regarding this incident. An Orange County SO incident report on Todashev dated 05/04/2013 indicated Todashev was arrested for Aggravated Battery (causing bodily harm or disability to another), a Second Degree Felony, for an incident involving two other individuals over a parking space.

# H. (U//FOCO) Laboratory Division Reports:

(U/FOKO) The scene of the shooting was secured and processed by the TP Field Office ERT and the Laboratory Shooting Reconstruction Team (LRST) to include use of Total Station.

(U// POGO) A review determined the cause of Todashev's death was "multiple gunshot wounds." Gunshot wound "A" to the head was almost straight down and probably incapacitating, meaning no purposeful movement after sustaining the injury. Gunshot wound "B" to the back torso (upper shoulder, left of spine) was at a similar angle to the head shot and hit the spine. This shot could have caused Todashev to drop, but was not incapacitating. The ME stated, during these shots Todashev was diagonal to the shooter and would have been bent forward. Gunshot wounds "A" and "B" likely occurred as Todashev was falling down. The ME stated Gunshot wound "C" to the back torso (upper right shoulder) was not incapacitating. The ME stated the bullet traveled left to right, back to front and downward. Gunshot wound "D" to the back torso (lower right shoulder) was consistent with Gunshot wound "C," however it was at a sharper angle and was not incapacitating. The ME stated the bullet traveled left to right, back to front and downward. Gunshot wounds "C" and "D" likely occurred as Todashev was twisting his body. Gunshot wounds "E," "F," and "G" in the left side torso and left arm were likely grouped, consistent with the shooter being at an angle to Todashev. These three shots made seven holes; two hit Todashev's heart and would have been incapacitating, although not immediately. The ME stated the results of the autopsy were consistent with Todashev falling forward toward the shooter with his head down. There was no evidence of close range firing in any of the gunshot wounds, no stipulating and no close contact shots.

(U/2000) Todashev sustained seven gunshot wounds. Five projectiles were recovered in the torso, and one was recovered in the head. One projectile exited the body and was recovered at the scene. Toxicology results revealed a presence of nicotine and caffeine. A full copy of the ME's report is included in the appendix section.



I have been advised this is an inquiry concerning the shooting and use of force incident which occurred on 05/22/2013, at \_\_\_\_\_\_ Orlando, Florida 32819.

I have read and signed a document entitled, "Warning and Assurance to Employee Requested to Provide Information Following A Shooting Incident."

I entered on duty as a Special Agent (SA) of the FBI on 11/08/2008. I was assigned to the Boston Field Office after completing New Agent's Training at Quantico, Virginia. I have served on Squad C-6, since Prior to that assignment, I was assigned to Squad C-5 Economic Crimes. My responsibilities on Squad C-6 include the Violent Incident Crime Program. In addition to my primary duties, I also serve as a member of the Boston Field Office's Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) team, for which I was selected three years ago.

Prior to my employment with the FBI, I was a Police Officer for the Oakland Police Department from My law

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And forcement experience includes hundreds of arrests and numerous high risk search warrants.

I have received a variety of specialized training in the FBI, to include safe streets survival, breaching, specialized tactical, close quarter combat, and firearms.

At the time of the operation, I was carrying my FBI-issued Glock 23, .40 caliber, with a chambered round and a fully loaded and topped off magazine with service ammunition.

Approximately one week after the 04/15/2013 bombings in Boston, I was assigned to work with the Massachusetts State Police (MSP) on a triple homicide that occurred on 09/11/2011 in Waltham, Massachusetts, in which Ibragim Todashev was a suspect. My MSP partners were Trooper who is a homicide expert, and Trooper who is a fugitive investigator. I was tasked to work with the Tampa Field Office, Orlando Resident Agency (ORA) to conduct an interview of Todashev about the homicide and any connections he may have to the Boston bombings on 04/15/2013.

I studied the background of Todashev and had a very good understanding of how much training he had in Mixed Martial Arts (MMA) and wrestling. During our investigation, I personally viewed several of Todashev's MMA fights on YouTube. Various interviews of Todashev's associates also indicated that he was an adept wrestler, and had competed in the sport for many years b6

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also understood that Todashev had been previously arrested in a road rage incident in Boston, Massachusetts, as well as an incident in Orlando, Florida. The arrest in Florida stemmed from a fight over a parking space in which Todashev fought with two individuals, one of which was knocked unconscious and lost several teeth. FBI Agents surveilling Todashev witnessed this event and relayed the details directly to me. On a scale of one to 10, I believed Todashev was an eight as far as his inclination and ability for physical violence.

During the week of 05/13/2013, myself and the MSP Troopers traveled to the ORA to interview Todashev regarding his time in Boston around the date of the homicide, no direct questions of the crime were planned. Upon arrival we decided ORA Agent

and Task Force Officer (TFO) would conduct the interview with Todashev since they had a rapport with him. The interview was conducted and we received pertinent information on the homicide and bombing investigations.

Once back in Boston, I learned that Todashev had tentative travel plans to return to Russia on 05/24/2013. The TFO's and I were instructed to travel back to the ORA in order to interview Todashev regarding the triple homicide. We arrived on 05/20/2013 and asked TFO\_\_\_\_\_\_to call Todashev to negotiate an interview. On 05/21/2013, TFO\_\_\_\_\_\_convinced Todashev to meet with us. Todashev stated that he would not meet with us at the b6 b7С

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Orlando Police Department as he did previously, and that if we wanted to meet, we had to come to him. Todashev eventually agreed to meet with us for one hour at his apartment.

On 05/21/2013, at 7:30 PM, myself, the MSP Troopers, and TFO met Todashev at his apartment in the parking lot. He was calm and respectful and led us to his apartment. I and the MSP Troopers went to the apartment and TFO remained outside in the parking lot. Prior to entering Todashev's apartment, we observed a large image of an AK-47 at the top of the front door. Todashev stated something to the effect that other Agents had previously observed the image, but that he could not remove it easily. Upon entering the apartment, Todashev asked us to remove our shoes and I noticed the room was very dark and hot. Todashev, turned on the kitchen light which dimly lit the entire first floor. There were no other light fixtures on the first floor that functioned. As I proceeded into the living room, I immediately noticed a sward hanging on the wall near the stairs. I was the first one in the room and I sat on the second stair step that led to a loft which was also sat in a chair in the living room and unlit. Trooper Trooper stood against the stairwell wall. Todashev then opened the louver blinds covering the sliding glass door at the rear of the apartment's first floor. It was still light outside, so the interior lighting was improved, although still

dimly lit. Todashev sat on the floor directly across from Trooper and in front of me to my left.

At approximately 7:45 PM I started the interview by asking some indirect questions. At approximately 8:30 PM, Trooper started direct questioning of Todashev about his presence in Boston during the time of the triple homicide. During this portion of the interview Trooper asked Todashev a direct question. It appeared Todashev did not like his tone and he replied "don't talk to me like that!" while pointing his finger directly at At that point, I felt that Todashev's stress level was very high, and that the possibility for him to react in a physical way was increased. I based this on my training and experience and my personal knowledge of his demeanor and capabilities. As a result I was on guard for any precipitous change in his behavior.

For the next three hours we continued to question Todashev in regards to the Waltham triple homicide. Todashev eventually alluded to the fact that he was going to tell us some information regarding the homicides, but that he first wanted to smoke a cigarette. Todashev also started twitching and looked very uncomfortable. Todashev signed a Miranda waiver form

At the end of the questioning Trooper

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asked

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Todashev began to ask whether he would be able to smoke in jail, how much time he would get, and if he would get a deal. We made no comment back to him indicating in any fashion that he was going to be arrested or go to jail. However, I felt at this point that Todashev knew he was going to jail and he began to **b6** appear resigned to that fact. h7Ch74 when Trooper left the apartment to make a phone call to the Middlesex Assistant District Attorney and I took his chair. Todashev moved to the edge of the bed 6 to 7 feet directly in front of me Trooper stood in the same location against the wall. At this point Todashev had not made any overt actions.

Todashev then requested to use the restroom for the third or fourth time. It should be noted that on each prior trip to the bathroom, which was located at the top of the stairs, it created a heightened sense of awareness for our safety. On this last trip to the bathroom, Todashev urinated only one quick burst, which led me to question whether he had to really go to the bathroom at all. Trooper and I made eye contact and gestured to one another that we need to be well aware of the threat Todashev posed in this position. The bathroom door was open, and Trooper and I were able to observe Todashev from the back. After he was done urinating, Todashev reached

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ver to the sink with his left hand and turned on the water. He then ran the water over his left hand, slowly brought his hand in front of his face. While looking down, he let the water drip from his fingers into the toilet. He slowly opened and closed his hand while waving his fingers. He repeated this process three to four times before slowly closing his fly and wiping his hands on the front of his pants. When he had finished in the bathroom, Trooper \_\_\_\_\_\_ and I went down the stairs with Todashev, where we returned to our previous positions. Todashev then resumed writing his statement.

I was reading my notepad when I heard a loud noise and suddenly felt a blow to the back of my head. I was knocked partially off my chair, but I caught myself. I saw Todashev running past me and I tried to grab him. I removed my weapon from the holster and aimed the gun at Todashev who had run towards the kitchen. I shouted "show me your hands!" I saw Trooper\_\_\_\_\_\_to my left, but don't know if he had his weapon drawn. I stood in the middle of the room and saw Todashev partially in the kitchen. I continuously yelled for Todashev to show me his hands, but he did not comply. I heard the sound of metal banging together like knives in a very hurried fashion. I believed that Todashev was trying to retrieve a weapon, and that he was successful in doing sq Ъ7С

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rodashev instantly ran at full speed from the kitchen directly towards me and Trooper I saw Todashev's left shoulder drop as he rounded the corner from the kitchen to the living room. It was obvious to me that Todashev was in an attacking posture. In the split second available to me to assess the threat posed by Todashev's wholly non-compliant actions, I was in fear for my life and the life of Trooper

There was no doubt in my mind that Todashev intended to kill both of us. In order to stop this threat, I shot Todashev three to four times. Todashev fell backwards, but did not go to the ground. He then re-established his footing and suddenly lunged again towards us. I then shot him 3 or 4 more times in order to stop his continuing deadly threat. This time Todashev fell to the ground face first and I believed the threat had been eliminated.

Trooper applied first aid to my head and Trooper and TFO entered the room. I yelled that everything was okay. Trooper checked Todashev for a pulse, but could not locate one. TFO called 911 for medical assistance. Once the fire department arrived I was transported to the hospital for my head injury.

I have been advised this is an inquiry concerning the shooting and use of force incident which occurred on 05/22/2013, at Orlando, Florida 32819. This interview focused on the existence of a consensual recording which included both audio and video.

I previously read and signed a document entitled, "Warning and Assurance to Employee Requested to Provide Information Following A Shooting Incident."

With respect to the recording of the interview of Ibragim Todashev, I want to make it clear I did not know the interview of Todashev was being recorded. My responses during my previous interview were focused on the shooting inquiry and the events which led up to me having to discharge my weapon.

I remember we were informed approximately 30 minutes before the scheduled interview by Orlando Police Department (OPD) Officer \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ that Todashev would meet with us but

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nly at his home. Todashev did not want to meet at the OPD as he had done previously but at his apartment. I, and Massachusetts State Police (MSP) Troopers and hurried to the location of the interview. On the car ride to the interview OPD Officer called on the vehicle's Bluetooth system. During our discussion concerning the interview, one of the MSP Troopers asked if Florida was a one or two party recording state. Officer said it was a one party state but advised they may want to mirandize Todashev. Ι don't recall any other discussion concerning recording interviews. I do not recall anyone specifically saying the interview was going to be recorded or videotaped. We wanted to conduct the interview at the police station in order for it to be recorded but things changed quickly and in the rush, a determination about recording the interview was not made.

During most of the interview of Todashev, I was sitting on the stairs and was standing to my left and behind me. I did not see any recording devices or video cameras at the time we interviewed Todashev.

I recall at some point during the interview, Todashev said "don't do that" and turned to Trooper I was not sure what Todashev was referring to and the interview continued.

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first learned the interview was recorded on Friday, May 24, 2013, when I received a message from Trooper who advised videos were uploaded to the Google cloud. Once I located the recordings on the computer I found there were both audio and video recordings of the interview of Todashev. I found out after the fact, Trooper had used a high definition recorder which he had placed on the kitchen counter which eventually ran out of battery life, at which point Trooper

switched to his telephone to continue the recording. I also found out after returning to Boston that Trooper had a recorder in his pocket during the interview. At the time of the interview, I did not know the interview was being recorded by anyone.

Trooper advised he had passed the videos to other individuals who had a need to know in his department. After this had happened, I did not think about the recording. When I returned to work after being off for the injury I received as a result of the assault on my person by Todashev, I was contacted with some additional questions regarding my initial by AI signed sworn statement. I mentioned to AI something to the effect of, it would be nice if we released the video because it would refute many of the press' allegations. ALwas very surprised by this because he did not know about the video's

existence. He advised he would need a copy. I mentioned to AI that I had only learned of the videos after the incident.

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I have been advised this is an inquiry concerning the shooting and use of force incident which occurred on 05/22/2013 at Orlando, Florida 32819.

I entered on duty as a Trooper with the Massachusetts State Police (MSP) in June of 2000. I am currently assigned to the Violent Fugitive Apprehension Section and have been since approximately 2007.

Prior to my employment with the MSP, I was a Police Officer for the Mansfield, Massachusetts Police Department from May of 1996 to June of 2000. My total approximate law enforcement experience includes hundreds of arrests, interviews and numerous high risk search warrants.

I have received a variety of law enforcement training to include search and rescue operations as well as patrol rifle usage.

Approximately one month ago, I was notified by my supervisor that I was temporarily assigned to investigate any links between the Boston Marathon bombing suspects and a triple homicide which had occurred in Waltham, Massachusetts in September of 2011. I was assigned to work with Boston FBI Special Agent (SA) in this assignment. Through investigation, Ibragim Todaschev was developed as a suspect in the homicide and as an associate of bombing subject Tamerlan Tsarnaev. MSP Trooper was assigned to work the Waltham homicide and later joined SA and I in the investigation of Todaschev.

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fogether, the MSP and FBI formed a plan to travel to Orlando, Florida to interview Todaschev in an effort to place him in the Boston area at the time of the Waltham homicides. SA handled the coordination with the Orlando FBI office. We learned that one of the Orlando Task Force Officers (TFO) was familiar with Todaschev from previous interviews and had rapport with him.

In preparing for the interview and I discussed Todaschev's skills in Mixed Martial Arts and had viewed open-source videos of one of his fights. We had also learned of his recent violent altercation in an Orlando area parking lot, as well as Todaschev's criminal history which contained acts of violence.

Due to our knowledge of Todaschev's physical abilities, the initial plan was to have him come to the Orlando Police Department for the interview; however, he refused. TFO was able to arrange the interview at the apartment where Todaschev had been living with

the FBI Todaschev had not been living at the apartment recently. Although we knew Todaschev was dangerous, we felt this interview was necessary as we had no physical evidence to link him to the homicide crime scene and we had information Todaschev was leaving the country in a matter of days. Based on these factors, we agreed to proceed with the interview at the apartment.

We arrived at the apartment at approximately 7:30 PM and met with Todaschev. He invited us inside and asked that we remove our shoes, which we did. I visually scanned the room for weapons and noticed a large, Samurai type sword mounted on the wall near the entrance to the kitchen. I also noticed two crystal ash trays on the table near the bed which appeared to be heavy and could potentially be used as weapons

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The interview was conducted primarily by Trooper SA and I participated at various times, mainly to refute various parts of Todaschev's story. TFO remained outside. During the course of the several-hour interview, Todaschev asked to go to the bathroom several times and was escorted each time by a member of the interview team.

As the questioning became centered on Todaschev's presence in the Boston area during the time of the Waltham homicides and his involvement in the murders, his demeanor changed. Todaschev smoked a cigarette, he repeatedly looked around the room, he became fidgety, and at times appeared to be stretching his legs and arms as he spoke.

 Eventually, Todaschev began to acknowledge

 At about this time, I stepped out to speak with TFO

 and to get Todaschev

 more cigarettes. I told TFO

 that Todaschev

 and asked

 to go

 around to the back of the apartment in case Todaschev tried to run out the back. At that time

 Todaschev began to chain smoke cigarettes.

As Todaschev continued to Trooper gave Trooper gave him then left the room to go outside to make phone calls. Todaschev asked about smoking and said he needed more cigarettes even though there was nearly a full pack on the table in front of him. I opined he was attempting to get me to leave the room. Shortly afterward, Todaschev again asked to go to the bathroom. SA escorted Todaschev upstairs to the bathroom. I came halfway up the stairs to make sure I could maintain visual contact with SA On this trip to the bathroom I noticed that Todaschev was moving noticeably slow, almost methodical in his movements.

When Todaschev was returning down the stairs, I was more and more concerned that he might try to flee or attack us. As I came down the stairs and turned toward the main room, I

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grabbed the sword from the wall and quickly stashed it in the kitchen to keep it from Todaschev's reach. Although Todaschev was still on the stairs, I believe he saw me hide the sword in the kitchen due to a large mirror positioned at the bottom of the stairway.

I was sitting on the stairs across from SA \_\_\_\_\_\_ who was sitting in a chair directly across from Todaschev, who was sitting on the bed. A small table separated SA \_\_\_\_\_\_ and Todaschev.

Due to Todaschev's continued erratic behavior, I sent a text message to SA which read: "Be on guard. He is in vulnerable position to do something bad. and Trooper Be on guard now. I see him looking around at times." I was waiting for SA BlackBerry to "ding" when my text came in but it didn't. After about a minute, I checked my phone to make sure the text went through. As I was looking at my phone, I heard a roaring noise, looked up and saw the table between Todaschev and SA rise up and fly toward I immediately yelled to alert Trooper there was trouble inside the SA residence. Todaschev ran from the bed toward the door near the kitchen area and began quickly scanning left to right as if looking for something. He then darted toward the door, I thought he was trying to flee and began to give chase. As Todaschev reached the door he grabbed a red, approximately five-foot long pole that was leaning against the wall near the door. Todaschev moved incredibly quickly, almost like something in a movie. As he grabbed the pole, Todaschev turned quickly toward me and raised the pole above his head with both hands, which appeared to me to be a trained fighting position, and charged toward me as if he was going to impale me with the pole. I then heard shots fired off to my right and saw Todaschev make two movements which indicated to me he had been impacted by the shots. Todaschev fell to his hands and knees

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In front of me and then, almost immediately, he sprang forward, coming up in a fighting stance. I heard more shots and Todaschev fell to the ground again, this time apparently incapacitated.

Immediately after Todaschev fell the second time, I heard SA yell "call 911." I turned to look toward SA and saw he was bleeding profusely from the head. Trooper and TFO had come to the residence door and I announced to them it was clear to come inside. I moved toward SA and applied pressure to a large laceration near the back of his head. When Trooper came in, I had him apply pressure to SA wound while I checked Todaschev. I was handed a rubber medical glove and I checked Todaschev for a carotid and ulnar pulse and was unable to locate one at either location. Todaschev's eyes were open and unblinking. I believed that Todaschev was deceased and did not move his body further to keep from disturbing the scene.

Todaschev had several opportunities to escape during the altercation, but instead chose to obtain a weapon and attack. Todaschev's actions placed me in fear of imminent physical injury or even death. I am certain SA actions saved me from serious physical injury or death.

I, Massachusetts State Police (MSP) Trooper and FBI Special b7C Agent were making the initial plans to interview Todashev. As I recall, a lot of logistical movement was going on and we still had not established a place to conduct the interview. Trooper and I were at our hotel and we had a brief Agent discussing regarding the recording of the interview. Our original thought was Todashev would meet us at the Orlando Police Department (OPD), where he had been interviewed before, and the interviews were recorded. As the evening drew closer, it became increasingly apparent that he did not want to meet with us. OPD Officer b6 managed to get Todashev to agree to meet with us at Todashev's apartment. b7C I mentioned that I had my high-definition recorder in my bag. When we asked Officer what time the interview was scheduled to start, he replied right now, or words to that effect

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Agent and I headed to Todashev's apartment. As we were driving to the location, we were talking to Officer over the Bluetooth device on the rental car. Trooper asked Officer if Florida was a one or two party recording state, to which he replied, it was a one party recording state but recommended we give Todashev his Miranda Rights if we were going to record anything. It is not uncommon for the MSP to record the interviews of subjects. I did not think much more about recording the interview.

Once we arrived at Todashev's apartment, we quickly began the interview. Todashev was talking and all three of us were taking notes. It was at this time I remembered about the personal digital recorder in my bag. I walked over to the dining room table where I had placed my bag when we first arrived, and got the recorder out. I deleted some family videos from the recorder prior to turning it on in order to be able to record the interview. I then placed it upright on the table facing Todashev in full view. It was about 20 minutes into the interview when I started the recording.

As Todashev was talking, I would walk over to check on the recorder. I watched to make sure it was still recording and at one point when it had stopped, the screen said the video card was full. I deleted some additional family videos and turned the recorder on again. After awhile, I again noticed the recorder had stopped recording due to lack of space to record. I again deleted additional family videos, as well as the first portion of the interview which contained what I thought was general conversation, nothing specific about the homicides. I then resumed recording when the conversation about the Waltham murders took place. My JVC recorder captured the Miranda Warning as Todashev walked right up to the recorder that was now placed on his kitchen counter

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At some point the battery failed and I pulled out my personal cellular telephone to record the interview. I was standing against the wall where the flag was located; and began to video with my Droid Razor cellular telephone. After a few minutes, Todashev looked in my direction and said "don't do that," or words to that effect. I turned off my cellular telephone. After sometime, I again began to record the interview with my cellular telephone. Todashev again said to turn it off, which I did. Later when Todashev took a cigarette break, I placed my cellular telephone on the dining room table and then resumed recording, while leaning my cellular phone upright against my bag. It remained there recording the interview until I needed to use it

While no questions were being asked. I turned off my cellular telephone recording device in order to use my phone. It was then that I saw a text message had come from the Assistant District Attorney stating "Don't put him in custody until we get a warrant." I then displayed this message to Agent I heard him ask Agent Agent responded stating, Todashev asked to go to the bathroom and Agent and I walked him up the stairs. Agent was at the top of the stairs and I was standing on the stairs about halfway up where I could maintain visual contact. We were on alert due to Todashev's strange behavior. He was moving extremely slow and looking around. As I came back down the stairs, I grabbed the sword on the wall near the flag and moved it behind a rack at the kitchen. I presumed Todashev saw me move the sword due to a large mirror placed at the bottom of the stairs that was strategically placed where as to see the door and hallway. Todashev returned to his position sitting on the bed

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on a folding chair directly in front of Todashev. I moved back to the stairs.

As I sat on the stairs, I began texting Trooper (who was now outside) and Agent to alert them to the feeling I had about Todashev's strange and nervous behavior. I sent a text message to Trooper and Agent to be on alert and on guard. It was while I was sitting on the stairs when Todashev flipped the coffee table.

I did not mention the recordings in the initial interview because I was concentrating on the actual shooting incident itself. Furthermore, I was never asked. The recordings were made known to other people involved in the handling of this case. Also, the recordings were provided to District Attorney's Office the day after we arrived back in Massachusetts. Nothing was out of the ordinary, as MSP tends to record subject interviews. Had I known the Shooting Incident Review Team was not aware of the recordings, I would have told them.

As ASAC Geeslin was the A/SAC, he served as the FBI on-scene commander during the incident. He arrived on-scene at approximately 12:52 AM. Upon arrival ASAC Geeslin did not ask any questions regarding the shooting.

ASAC Geeslin notified the INSD, SIOC, and others as required regarding the Agent-involved shooting. He later spoke with Deputy Director Sean M. Joyce to advise him of the details of 'the shooting and the welfare of the Agent-involved. ASAC Geeslin deployed TP ERT to the scene and Agents to assist with securing the scene. The Agent involved with the shooting was injured during the incident and both the Agent and one of the Massachusetts State Police Troopers was transported to the local hospital. ASAC Geeslin detailed two Agents to the hospital to accompany both the Agent and the Trooper.

ASAC Geeslin contacted SAC Danny Banks from the Florida Department of Law Enforcement to provide a briefing of the Agent-involved shooting. SAC Banks offered his assistance with no further questions concerning the incident.

Once TODASHEV's knee healed, he wanted to return to Boston, MA to resume his MMA training. TODASHEV estimates he lived in Atlanta, GA for one to one and a half years. He never owned a vehicle while living in Atlanta, GA. TODASHEV did not recall whether he made his return trip to Boston, MA by bus or plane.

When TODASHEV arrived back in Boston, MA, he moved to Allston or Brighton on Gordon Street. At that location, he moved in with "a bunch of students." TODASHEV did not recall who they were, but there were three or four of them. He did not know them prior to moving in with them. TODASHEV staved at address until the beginning of September 2011. TODASHEV stated that he stayed at for "the first ten days" of September, then he moved back to Atlanta, GA. He thinks he took a GREYHOUND bus back to Atlanta, GA. He left from downtown Boston, travelled alone, and he thinks he left in the daytime. TODASHEV paid cash for the ticket, and he used the name IBRAGIM TODASHEV to buy the ticket. They do however still stay in contact with one another. TODASHEV estimates that they can be in contact with each other almost daily at times. Whenever is in Russia, they will stay in contact over SKYPE. does not have a FACEBOOK account, however, sometimes she uses TODASHEV's. TODASHEV does not know very well. does not interfere in their relationship, and he has only met her on two or three occasions. The last time TODASHEV saw was during a recent trip to Georgia to renew the registration on his vehicle, which actually belongs to TODASHEV met with at her residence and was there. He arrived late in the evening, and he spent the night. The next day TODASHEV renewed the vehicle registration and spent an additional night at The next day, TODASHEV and left for Atlanta together.

A couple days before TODASHEV left Boston for Atlanta, he got together with and They all drove around Boston together, however, TODASHEV does not remember what they did specifically. 

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

I know from training, experience, and watching a lot sanctioned fights how dangerous these men can be. I told this suspect if he tried to fight with us I would shoot him. This suspect was compliant and was secured without incident.
I had this suspect roll over to his buttocks and helped him to his feet. Once on his feet the suspect commented that the vehicles behind us are FBI agents that have been following him. I noticed 3 (three) vehicles with dark tint. These vehicles began to leave the area. I noticed one vehicle was driven by a male, had a computer stand and appeared to be talking on a radio.

(U) The Chief ME explained the ME report is made up of the investigative portion, based on hearsay, and the autopsy report. According to the Chief ME, the ME report is usually provided to the agency involved which would be the FBI and the State Attorney's Office.

(U//DOC) The Chief ME advised the overall the results of the autopsy were consistent with Todashev falling forward toward the shooter with head down. There was no stipulating and no close contact shots. The shooter was not standing over Todashev nor behind Todashev.

(U//For The Chief ME further noted Todashev's cause of death was "multiple gunshot wounds." Gunshot wound "A" to the head was almost straight down and probably incapacitating, meaning no purposeful movement after sustaining the injury. Gunshot wound "B" to the back torso (upper shoulder, left of spine) was at a similar angle to the head shot and hit the spine. This shot could have caused Todashev to drop, but was not incapacitating. The ME stated, during these shots, Todashev was diagonal to the shooter and would have been bent forward. Gunshot wounds "A" and "B" likely occurred as Todashev was falling down. The ME stated Gunshot wound "C" to the back torso (upper right shoulder) was not incapacitating. The ME stated the bullet traveled left to right, back to front and downward. Gunshot wound "D" to the back torso (lower right shoulder) was consistent with Gunshot wound "C," however it was at a sharper angle and

was not incapacitating. The ME stated the bullet traveled left to right, back to front and downward. Gunshot wounds "C" and "D" likely occurred as Todashev was twisting his body. Gunshot wounds "E," "F," and "G" in the left side torso and left arm were likely grouped, consistent with the shooter being at an angle to Todashev. These three shots made seven holes; two hit Todashev's heart and would have been incapacitating, although not immediately. The ME stated the results of the autopsy were consistent with Todashev falling forward toward the shooter with his head down. There was no evidence of close range firing in any of the gunshot wounds, no stipulating and no close contact shots.

 $(U//\square\square\square)$  The Chief ME advised the trajectory of the head and shoulder wounds, the combination of the seven entrance wounds to include the paths of the bullets, were inconsistent with other possible scenarios. First, due to the extreme downward trajectory of the wounds to the head ("A") and upper shoulder ("B"), were inconsistent with the shooter being behind Todashev as if Todashev was running away. Rather, those extreme downward trajectories could have occurred when Todashev had his back to the shooter, only if: 1.) Todashev leaned backwards at a severe angle toward the shooter; or 2.) Todashev was standing below a shooter who was above him; or 3.) Todashev was shot while both he and the shooter were prone on the floor.

(U/PCO) Todashev sustained seven gunshot wounds. Five projectiles were recovered in the torso, and one was recovered in the head. One projectile exited the body and was recovered at the scene. Toxicology results revealed a presence of nicotine and caffeine.
