Re: Updated Public Records Request on DOD 1033 Program

Dear Attorney Halpin:

As you know, that ACLU of Massachusetts submitted a request for public records relating to the Department of Defense (DOD) "1033 Program" on May 4, 2012. On June 18, 2012, you replied that the fees for responsive documents would exceed \$3,710.00.

I recently spoke with Joseph Kelly, who explained how the records on the 1033 program are kept. With that knowledge, I am now requesting the following shortened list of documents as the <u>first part</u> of the May 4th request, in an attempt to receive the most crucial documents first. We may follow-up with a request for further documents at a later date.

We are requesting the following documents:

- 1. The template used for Memoranda of Understanding (MOAs) between the State Police and local law enforcement agencies relating to the DOD 1033 program, or a copy of an actual MOA that is identical to other MOAs. Mr. Kelly explained that the State Police has MOAs with approximately 200 agencies, and that they all follow the same template.
- 2. A list of all of the MOAs signed between the state police and local police departments.
- 3. All reports of equipment taken possession of by local law enforcement agencies under the Department of Defense 1033 program from March 2011 through February 2012. I understand that in March of 2012, new software was installed, and that this new software does not currently allow you to print such reports.

I hope that this narrower request is manageable, and I look forward to hearing from you soon. Please let me know if I can clarify any part of this request.
