Dear Ms. Rotolo:

This responds to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request.

Based on the information you provided, we conducted a search of the indices to our Central Records System for: Records describing the formal structure of information sharing between JTTF and (a) e-Gaurdian, (b) the Information Sharing Environment, and (c) local intelligence agencies in Massachusetts, including the Boston Regional Intelligence Center (BRIC), the Commonwealth Fusion Center (CFC) and the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority (MBTA) or the Massachusetts Department of Transportation (Mass DOT); Records describing the procedure and standards for sharing of information or intelligence with the Commonwealth Fusion Center and with the (BRIC); records of communications between the JTTF and the BRIC and CFC concerning access to information and operational responsibility for investigations; Memorandum of Understanding, contracts or agreements between the JTTF and (a) any federal agency, (b) the Commonwealth of Massachusetts or any department, agency, authority or official of the Commonwealth, and (c) any Massachusetts city or town or any department, agency of official of a Massachusetts city or town proving for the collection, disclosure or sharing of information or intelligence concerning individuals or organizations.

We were unable to identify responsive main file records. If you have additional information pertaining to the subjects and you believe it was of investigative interest to the Bureau, please provide us the details and we will conduct an additional search.

You may file an appeal by writing to the Director, Office of Information Policy (OIP), U.S. Department of Justice, 1425 New York Ave., NW, Suite 11050, Washington, D.C. 20530-0001. Your appeal must be received by OIP within sixty (60) days from the date of this letter in order to be considered timely. The envelope and the letter should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Appeal." Please cite the FOIPA Request Number assigned to your request so that it may be identified easily.

Enclosed for your information is a copy of the FBI File Fact Sheet.
