

Budget / Project Status:

UASI FFY14 Investment Area Spending

- Significant funds have either been encumbered or spent since the January 2016 JPOC Meeting.
- Overall, 76.2% of UASI FFY14 have been either encumbered or spent- \$10,168,491.00

Transfer Switches:

- Project involves the installation of an emergency panel, transfer switch and generator docking station at identified shelter sites in each jurisdiction.
- Award letters have been sent to Chelsea and Cambridge; projects are underway.
- Environmental Planning and Historic Preservation (EHP) approval still needed for all other jurisdictions.
- Total Project cost: \$300,000
- Project deadline: June 30, 2016.

CBRNE

Hazardous Analytical Mobile Response Vehicle (HAMR):

- Vehicle will be put into service week of February 8
- Regional asset for MBHSR
- Total cost: \$137,000

Zumro Tents:

- Portable decon medical tents
- Purchased for Boston, Cambridge, Everett, Quincy, Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center (BIDMC), Boston Medical Center (BMC) and Tufts Medical Center

Total project cost: \$348,000

Communications Interoperability

Subscriber Units:

- 198 Motorola APX7000 dual band radios purchased
- 276 Motorola APX6000 single band radios purchased
- Combined project cost of \$2M across FFY14 and FFY15

Online Pre-Requisitions:

OEM is modernizing the pre-requisition process.

- Creating a streamlined process.
- Allows for remote response from JPOC.
- Allows OEM/JPOC to track requests via email.
- Allows OEM to make real-time updates to the form.
- Allows stakeholders to become more familiar with UASI plans, project justification numbers and grant year.
- Two types of pre requisition forms:
 - o Equipment/Services: bit.ly/pre_req
 - o Training/Travel: bit.ly/teprereq
- OEM will no longer accept paper pre-requisition forms as of March 2, 2016.
- OEM to email JPOC a comprehensive workflow of the pre-requisition process.
- OEM to email JPOC an updated list of investment area subcommittee members.

Request: Potentially develop a SWAT concept of operations (CONOPS) to ensure consistent SWAT standards across the region.

SWAT Supervisors and Management Training:

- Training for up to 20 SWAT Commanders
- Overview of SWAT standards and professionalism, selection, training and discipline of SWAT personnel and supervisors
- Development of tactical plans for high-risk situations
- Decision making based on priority of life during violent incidents
- Understanding the legal issues involved in the problem-solving process of high-risk events
- Major incidents debrief
- Offering two sessions:
 - o Stoneham 3/7-3/11

Revere 3/14-3/18

Charter Amendment Working Group:

- The MBHSR JPOC Charter is silent on a variety of issues.
- Sgt. Mike Kiely voiced concerns the Charter is not being followed accurately (not sure how we want to word this- he talked about Open Meeting and AGO standards)
- OEM would like to create a Charter Amendment working group to refine existing protocols.

- Deputy Kelly Nee, and Sergeant Mike Kiely volunteered to participate in the proposed working group.
- o The City of Boston Legal Department will also participate in the working group.
- o OEM will email the JPOC to finalize the list of working group members.

Med Surge Subcommittee

- Med Surge covers EMS, hospitals and public health departments
- Jurisdictional representation is sparse; need more representation from jurisdictions other than Boston
- Med Surge funding is determined by the MBHSR Strategy.
- Stacey Kokaram stated that BPHC has been waiting for OEM to schedule a Med Surge meeting. In the meantime, BPHC continues to meet through other public health-related working groups to discuss med surge-related initiatives.
- Stacey Kokaram to email OEM the list of public health stakeholders with whom BPHC regularly meets.
- Schedule of Med Surge meeting to follow.

Request: JPOC to provide OEM with a POC for Med Surge representation.

Wrap Up:

- Boston EMS Mass Casualty Incident Seminar
 - o "When Terror Strikes- Maximizing Survival during Multi-Strike Attacks"
 - Opportunity to hear firsthand accounts from Parisians involved in the response operations in November 2015 Paris attacks.
 - Managing the medical consequences of coordinated attacks, including resource allocation, coordination and communication efforts
 - Best practices used to support the continuum of patient care from on scene through the healthcare system
 - Adapting response operations in a high threat environment to maximize responder and public safety
 - o March 3, 2016 Boston Convention & Exhibition Center, Room 156ABC.
- MBHSR in the News
 - o Boston Police Officer shot; UASI purchased tourniquet used to save his life.
 - o Quincy Fire used Hazmat Training from DelValle Center to DeCon a site.
 - Cambridge- K9 Dixie article describing how useful the K-9 program has been in dealing with suspicious packages, gunshot calls and security sweeps
