thank you for returning my call yesterday.

I am writing just to make sure that there is no discrepancy in my understanding of the reason why the National Lawyers Guild would not be receiving any documents/records/transcripts of interviews of our clients Susan Barney, Ridgely Fuller, Richard Hess, and

Patrick Keaney, conducted by BRIC officers: Det. Kelley, Det. Creed, and Trooper Favale on January 8, 2009, or any other documents responsive to our public records request.

As you stated yesterday, BRIC officers did not conduct formal interviews with our clients; their meeting with our clients was informal and served a very simple purpose to just inform our clients whom they should contact if they become aware of any individuals engaged in activities that, in your words, "go beyond what's allowed by law."

Because of purely informal nature of the meeting, it was not recorded and there were no notes taken; thus there are no written reports from nor audio recording of the interviews.

Please let me know if I have misunderstood what you have said.
