In response to your inquiry of September 9, 2013, I have completed my investigation of your request for records and arrived at the following conclusion, I am respectfully declining to release the information you have requested under the public records law, more specifically, Exemption (a) – The Statutory Exemption, Exemption (b) – Personnel Practices, Exemption (c) – The Privacy Exemption, and Exemption (f) – The Investigatory Exemption.

You have the right to appeal your request to the Division of Public Records, namely the “Supervisor.” You have (90) days from the date of your original request to appeal to the Supervisor. The appeal must include a copy of your original request and any response from the records custodian. The decisions are on a case-by-case basis at the discretion of the Supervisor. The Supervisor will provide an opinion on the appropriateness of the records custodian’s response and a determination as to whether the requested record is public¹
