Reallocation of Funding

- SRT U17-1.2 Brenda Jones, Boston OEM, reported on this project.
 - Boston Police is looking to re-allocate UASI FY17 funding to purchase a Bearcat,
 \$380,000, and Tactical First Aid Kits, \$15,000. The following equipment, amounting to
 \$294,400, would be deferred:
 - Rapid Deployment Vehicle \$150,000
 - PPG Chemical Suits \$20,000
 - PPG Mask Technology \$60,000
 - Long Range NUG Device \$53,000
 - Thermal Imaging Unit \$67,000
 - An additional \$102,500 in funding would be made available by advancing several FY17 projects to FY16
 - Superintendent Colm Lydon, Boston Police, discussed the benefits of an armored vehicle as it is easier to drive around the city.
 - o Brenda reminded the group that purchasing a Bearcat with UASI funds will still have to be approved by EOPSS.
 - o MOTION: Reallocate funding to acquire Bearcat and Tactical First Aid Kits.

- Microwave Backhaul U15-4.4 Sarah Plowman, Boston OEM, reported on this project.
 - Sarah requested the JPOC to consider reallocating \$39,852.36 of funding from the U15-4.1 Technology Consultant for the final phase of the Microwave Backhaul project. This phase will complete work in Cambridge, Everett and Somerville.
