- o 11 total intel abstract submitted
 - Majority are hardware/software related
- o Initial review of all abstracts received.
- o Withdrawal of digital video cameras submitted by Chelsea in the hopes that current cost savings can procure.
- Withdrawal of regional data analysis capability by David Carabin as it would not be considered a priority.
- o Cancellation of Digital Forensics Vehicles abstract as it would not be grant allowable. Vehicles for this purpose would not be considered prime movers.
- o The subcommittee chose to combine the Blackbag Technologies, Fatpot maintenance, and computer equipment abstracts into the overall hardware/software abstract.
 - Request to Steve Donahue re Blackbag (is it a one-time purchase or ongoing service. This will determine if we can use expiring funding)
- Social Media Power User abstract combined with the overall Social Media Analytics abstract.
