VERIFIED PETITION TO AMEND CERTIFICATE OF NATURALIZATION

NOW COMES Petitioner, by and through his attorneys, Shechan Phinney Bass + Green, PA, and pursuant to 8 C.F.R. § 334.16(b)¹, petitions this Honorable Court to amend his certificate of naturalization for the reasons set forth herein, and in support states as follows:

Jurisdiction/Venue





11. Petitioner, a young boy at the time, obeyed his father's wishes and did not mention the mistaken birth date. Further, even if Petitioner had wanted to facilitate a correction, there may not have been an opportunity for him to do so, because his father was in control of the process and all of the family's documents.

12. Petitioner's family finally arrived in the United States in September 1991, when Petitioner was fifteen years old. Petitioner immediately enrolled at and graduated in 1993. He then obtained both an associate's degree and a bachelor's degree in Mechanical Engineering, from

respectively. He pursued his education while running a successful plumbing business, which he continues to operate today. Petitioner has held a master plumber's license for over ten years. Since his arrival in the United States, Petitioner has conducted himself in an upright, law-abiding and productive manner.

13. On July 10, Petitioner was admitted as a U.S. Citizen in this Honorable Court. At that time, Petitioner was a years old.

14. Petitioner attested to the accuracy of the birth date listed in his naturalization papers, [redacted] because he had been using that birth date since his arrival in the United States six years prior, the birth date matched the remainder of his immigration documents, and he was not in possession of any documentation to prove his actual birth

³ Petitioner's mother passed away three mouths after the family's arrival in the United States.



date. Thus, he felt he had no choice but to continue to affirm [redacted] as his birth date. Further, Petitioner believed that his actual birth date was of little significance, given that his culture does not emphasize individuals' ages or celebrate birthdays.

15. Recently. Petitioner has obtained a certified copy of his birth certificate from his home district in the last also obtained certified copies of his primary school records from the district in Education and Training, attached hereto as Exhibit B. Petitioner now wishes to amend his certificate of naturalization to reflect his true and correct birth date, as evidenced by these official documents.

16. Petitioner is prepared to seek amendments of Social Security records, his driver's license, his passport, and other official documents, to reflect his actual birth date, upon approval of this petition. Petitioner has not yet attempted to amend any of those records or documents, as he does not wish to create potentially irreversible inconsistencies before this Petition is decided.

Petition for Amendment

17. Petitioner is seeking an Order of this Court, pursuant to 8 C.F.R. § 334.16(b), ordering Respondent to amend and issue a Certificate of Naturalization, replacing Certificate No. Certific

18. While the applicable U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services [USCIS] regulations do not permit administrative amendment of the birth date on a certificate of naturalization absent a clerical error,⁴ this Court may order such an amendment pursuant

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^{*8} C.F.R. § 338.5 governs the procedure and requirements for correcting a Certificate of Naturalization where a clerical error is alleged. Because no clerical error on the part of the U.S. government is alleged in the present case, Petitioner did not file a Form N-565 for correction of his Certificate. Rather, this is a matter for the discretion of the federal court.

to 8 C.F.R. § 334.16(b). See Kouanchao v. USCIS, 358 F. Supp. 2d 837, 839-840 (D. Minn, 2005) (citing 8 C.F.R. §§ 338.5, 334.16); Varghai v. Immigration and Naturalization Service, 932 F. Supp. 1245, 1246 (D. Or. 1996).

- 19. The Petitioner bears the burden of showing that the birth date on his certificate of naturalization is incorrect and that [redacted], his true date of birth. See Kouanchao, 358 F. Supp. 2d at 838.
- 20. Courts have granted petitions to correct the birth date on a certificate of naturalization where "there was strong evidence that the birth date on the certificate was incorrect, and there was no indication that the petitioner had acted fraudulently or in bad faith." Hussain v. USCIS, 541 F. Supp. 2d. 1082, 1086 (2008 D. Minn.) (internal citations omitted). Unlike the USCIS' restricted authority to amend certificates, "courts have not confined themselves to correcting inadvertent mistakes" and have "granted petitions to amend even when the petitioner admitted that he knew that the date of birth that he supplied to United States immigration officials was not correct." Hussain, 541 F. Supp. 2d. at 1086-1087; see also Nguyen v. U.S. Dept. of Homeland Security, 2007 WI. 2156649, *2, 5 (S.D. N.Y. 2007) (Petitioner, a refugee from Vietnam, understated his date of birth by nine years, based on his mistaken belief that he had to be a certain age to attend school in the U.S., and continued to use the incorrect birth date on all government documents thereafter; nonetheless, the Court determined his actions did not constitute fraud and granted his petition to amend certificate of naturalization).
- 21. In <u>Hussain</u>, the court granted the petition to amend the date of birth on the naturalization certificate because the petitioner presented clear and convincing evidence that the certificate was inaccurate, and, although the facts demonstrated that the petitioner



"must have known that the birth date that he provided to United States immigration officials was not correct," this did not bar his petition because there was no evidence of fraudulent intent. 541 F. Supp. 2d. at 1087-1089. The petitioner had not misrepresented his age to gain any immigration benefits. <u>Id.</u> at 1087. The court explained that the important thing was "not whether the petitioner [had] reason to believe that he gave an incorrect date to immigration officials[] [but] whether, in giving the incorrect date, the petitioner acted fraudulently or in bad faith." <u>Id.</u> at 1089. The court recognized that exact birth dates and ages in the petitioner's home country of India were not as significant as they are in the U.S. today, and credited his testimony that his true birth date simply did not matter to him until now. <u>Id.</u> at 1088-1089.


22. The facts of the present case are similar. Here, although the Petitioner knew that the birth date on his immigration and naturalization documents was inaccurate, he did not feel the error was significant and it did not affect him or matter to him. Petitioner's inattention to what he always considered a minor typographical error was not the result of fraudulent misrepresentation nor was it for the purpose of gaining immigration benefits for which he would not otherwise be eligible. Further, the Petitioner in this case has presented clear and convincing evidence of his true date of birth in the form of a certified birth certificate, certified school records and certified translations. See Exhibits A and B; see also Nguyen, 2007 WL 2156649 at *4 (finding petitioner had satisfied the burden of providing "unequivocal evidence" of his true birth date, where his testimony was credible and the certified copy of his birth certificate, obtained from his home district and province, was authentic and in order).



23. Kouanchao v. USCIS is also instructive, where the petitioner had obtained a false birth certificate as a teenager in his war-torn home country of Laos, in order to register for high school. 358 F. Supp. 2d at 838. The petitioner continued to use the incorrect birth date from that point forward, including throughout his immigration and naturalization proceedings. Id. Eventually, the petitioner obtained documentation of his true birth date, which he used to correct his birth date in both the Social Security records and on his driver's license. Id. However, the petitioner was forced to petition the court to amend his certificate of naturalization when he was unable to renew his passport because the birth dates on his expired passport and certificate of naturalization did not match his new driver's license. Id.

24. Under these facts, the court granted the petition to amend and ordered the USCIS to issue a corrected certificate. Id. at 840. Although the petitioner had sworn that his birth date was correct throughout his immigration and naturalization proceedings, the court reasoned, "after fleeing a war-torn nation and possessing no documentation containing the correct date, it would have been reasonable for him to assume that confirmation of his exact birth date would have been difficult, if not impossible." Id. at 838. In a similar case, Nguyen y. U.S. Department of Homeland Security, the court found the petitioner's misstatements did not "rise to the level of deliberate falsehoods," even where he knowingly understated his age for the purpose of attending school in the United States. 2007 WL 2156649 at *2, 5. Petitioner in that case was a Vietnamese refugee who, even after learning there was no age requirement to attend school in the U.S., continued to use the incorrect birth date on all formal government documents. Id. at *2. The court concluded that it was "fair for him, like Kouanchao, to assume that it





would be very difficult to expose his misrepresentation without possessing proper documents" and furthermore, even if he did possess such documents, "his hesitance to present [them] out of fear of sanction or reprisal [was] understandable." Id. at *5.

Likewise, in the present case, given the circumstances of the Petitioner's childhood and his family's departure from Vietnam under political persecution, and his lack of official documentation of his birth date, it is reasonable for the Petitioner to have assumed that confirmation of his true birth date would have been difficult or impossible.

25. The Kouanchao court found that the petitioner did not intentionally mislead the government nor did he receive any immigration benefit by misstating his birth date. 358 F. Supp. 2d at 839. In a similar holding, the Nguyen court found that the government was not misled to its detriment based on the inaccurate birth date, and the revelation of the petitioner's true age would not have prevented his entry to the U.S. 2007 WL 2156649 at *5. Similarly, the Petitioner here has not intentionally misled the government nor has he received any immigration benefit based on the incorrect birth date.

Furthermore, if his birth date is subsequently corrected in the Social Security Administration's records, his eligibility for Social Security benefits will be delayed by three years.

26. Regarding the amount of time that had passed between the occurrence of the mistake and the filing of the petition, the <u>Kouanchao</u> court noted, "[a]Ithough it would have been preferable for [the petitioner] to have not made the mistake in the first place, or to have corrected the mistake at an earlier time, the passage of time does not bar his application." 358 F. Supp. 2d. at 839. There, as in the instant case, the government suffered no prejudice from the lapse of time. Id.

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- 27. In another case with comparable facts, <u>Varghai v. Immigration and Naturalization</u>

 <u>Service</u>, a citizen originally from fran sought correction of his date of birth on his certificate of naturalization after the original mistake originated from a translation error by government officials in his home country. <u>Varghai</u>, 932 F. Supp. at 1245. The government refused to correct his certificate of naturalization. <u>Id</u>.
- 28. The court held in favor of the petitioner, finding that his mistake "was not made with an improper motive or with the intent to commit fraud or misrepresentation." <u>Id.</u> at 1247; <u>see also Kouanchao</u>, 358 F. Supp. at 839 (finding no improper motive).
- 29. These facts are in line with the present case, where Petitioner had no fraudulent intent or improper motive in allowing the mistaken birth date to perpetuate. The mistaken birth date did not qualify him for any immigration benefit he would not have otherwise been eligible to receive. Petitioner's young age at the time the mistake occurred, together with the tumultuous state of affairs in his home country and his family's justifiable fear and sense of urgency in fleeing Vietnam, explain the reason for Petitioner's inability to correct the mistake when it occurred. The fact that his culture places little to no significance on age and birth dates, in contrast to cultural and social norms in the United States, explains why the error never concerned the Petitioner until now.
 - 30. In Varghai, the court acknowledged that

individuals applying for citizenship, through their lack of understanding and inability to understand English, place great and, in fact, almost absolute reliance on the clerks and representatives of the Government ... the applicants are excited, ill at ease and sometimes puzzled, and this is understood for they are being given the greatest right and privilege which this Government can bestow on any person.

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932 F. Supp. at 1247 (quoting <u>Petition of Garcia</u>, 65 F. Supp. 143 (W.D. Pa. 1946) (noting that "[a] though the court was referring to U.S. government officials in its reasoning, the same can be said of Petitioner's faith in Iranian officials")).

- 31. This passage reflects one court's understanding of the challenges immigrants face in immigration and naturalization proceedings, and the great faith immigrants place in the officials handling their applications. This reasoning may apply even more poignantly to refugees, such as the Petitioner, who have already survived horrific ordeals in their own countries and are completely at the mercy of the humanitarian efforts of the U.S. government.
- 32. Denial of Petitioner's request would be inequitable and unnecessary considering the facts.

No one wants gratuitously to impose upon naturalization proceedings that technical spirit which easily follows a literal application of so detailed a statute, and which results in vexatious disappointment, and in needless irritation, to a defenseless class of persons necessarily lest to the guidance of officials, except in so far as the courts may mitigate the rigors of their interpretation.

Kouanchao, 358 F. Supp. 2d at 838 (internal citations omitted).

Conclusion

33. Based on the foregoing, Petitioner requests this Court order an amendment of his certificate of naturalization to reflect his true birth date. Petitioner has provided unequivocal evidence of his true birth date in the form of a certified birth certificate and certified school records, with certified translations, and has shown good cause for such an amendment, with no resulting prejudice to the U.S. government.

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WHEREFORE, Petitioner respectfully requests this Court:

A. Order U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services to issue a Certificate of Naturalization which will indicate that Petitioner's correct date of birth is [redacted].



B. Grant such further relief in Petitioner's favor as the Court deems reasonable and equitable.


to 8 C.F.R. § 334.16(b). See Kouanchao v. USCIS. 358 F. Supp. 2d 837, 839-840 (D. Minn. 2005) (citing 8 C.F.R. §§ 338.5, 334.16); Varghai v. Immigration and Naturalization Service, 932 F. Supp. 1245, 1246 (D. Or. 1996).

- 19. The Petitioner bears the burden of showing that the birth date on his certificate of naturalization is incorrect and that [redacted], his true date of birth. See Kouanchao, 358 F. Supp. 2d at 838.
- 20. Courts have granted petitions to correct the birth date on a certificate of naturalization where "there was strong evidence that the birth date on the certificate was incorrect, and there was no indication that the petitioner had acted fraudulently or in bad faith." Hussain v. USCIS, 541 F. Supp. 2d. 1082, 1086 (2008 D. Minn.) (internal citations omitted). Unlike the USCIS' restricted authority to amend certificates, "courts have not confined themselves to correcting inadvertent mistakes" and have "granted petitions to amend even when the petitioner admitted that he knew that the date of birth that he supplied to United States immigration officials was not correct." Hussain, 541 F. Supp. 2d. at 1086-1087; see also Nguyen v. U.S. Dept. of Homeland Security, 2007 WI. 2156649, *2, 5 (S.D. N.Y. 2007) (Petitioner, a refugee from Vietnam, understated his date of birth by nine years, based on his mistaken belief that he had to be a certain age to attend school in the U.S., and continued to use the incorrect birth date on all government documents thereafter; nonetheless, the Court determined his actions did not constitute fraud and granted his petition to amend certificate of naturalization).
- 21. In <u>Hussain</u>, the court granted the petition to amend the date of birth on the naturalization certificate because the petitioner presented clear and convincing evidence that the certificate was inaccurate, and, although the facts demonstrated that the petitioner

"must have known that the birth date that he provided to United States immigration officials was not correct," this did not bar his petition because there was no evidence of fraudulent intent. 541 F. Supp. 2d. at 1087-1089. The petitioner had not misrepresented his age to gain any immigration benefits. <u>Id.</u> at 1087. The court explained that the important thing was "not whether the petitioner [had] reason to believe that he gave an incorrect date to immigration officials[] [but] whether, in giving the incorrect date, the petitioner acted fraudulently or in bad faith." <u>Id.</u> at 1089. The court recognized that exact birth dates and ages in the petitioner's home country of India were not as significant as they are in the U.S. today, and credited his testimony that his true birth date simply did not matter to him until now. <u>Id.</u> at 1088-1089.

22. The facts of the present case are similar. Here, although the Petitioner knew that the birth date on his immigration and naturalization documents was inaccurate, he did not feel the error was significant and it did not affect him or matter to him. Petitioner's inattention to what he always considered a minor typographical error was not the result of fraudulent misrepresentation nor was it for the purpose of gaining immigration benefits for which he would not otherwise be eligible. Further, the Petitioner in this case has presented clear and convincing evidence of his true date of birth in the form of a certified birth certificate, certified school records and certified translations. See Exhibits A and B; see also Nguyen, 2007 WL 2156649 at *4 (finding petitioner had satisfied the burden of providing "unequivocal evidence" of his true birth date, where his testimony was credible and the certified copy of his birth certificate, obtained from his home district and province, was authentic and in order).



23. Kouanchao v. USCIS is also instructive, where the petitioner had obtained a false birth certificate as a teenager in his war-torn home country of Laos, in order to register for high school. 358 F. Supp. 2d at 838. The petitioner continued to use the incorrect birth date from that point forward, including throughout his immigration and naturalization proceedings. Id. Eventually, the petitioner obtained documentation of his true birth date, which he used to correct his birth date in both the Social Security records and on his driver's license. Id. However, the petitioner was forced to petition the court to amend his certificate of naturalization when he was unable to renew his passport because the birth dates on his expired passport and certificate of naturalization did not match his new driver's license. Id.

24. Under these facts, the court granted the petition to amend and ordered the USCIS to issue a corrected certificate. Id. at 840. Although the petitioner had sworn that his birth date was correct throughout his immigration and naturalization proceedings, the court reasoned, "after fleeing a war-torn nation and possessing no documentation containing the correct date, it would have been reasonable for him to assume that confirmation of his exact birth date would have been difficult, if not impossible." Id. at 838. In a similar case, Nguyen v. U.S. Department of Homeland Security, the court found the petitioner's misstalements did not "rise to the level of deliberate falsehoods," even where he knowingly understated his age for the purpose of attending school in the United States. 2007 WL 2156649 at *2, 5. Petitioner in that case was a Victnamese refugee who, even after learning there was no age requirement to attend school in the U.S., continued to use the incorrect birth date on all formal government documents. Id. at *2. The court concluded that it was "fair for him, like Kouanchao, to assume that it





would be very difficult to expose his misrepresentation without possessing proper documents" and furthermore, even if he did possess such documents, "his hesitance to present [them] out of fear of sanction or reprisal [was] understandable." Id, at *5.

Likewise, in the present case, given the circumstances of the Petitioner's childhood and his family's departure from Vietnam under political persecution, and his lack of official documentation of his birth date, it is reasonable for the Petitioner to have assumed that confirmation of his true birth date would have been difficult or impossible.

25. The Kouanchao court found that the petitioner did not intentionally mislead the government nor did he receive any immigration benefit by misstating his birth date. 358 F. Supp. 2d at 839. In a similar holding, the Nguyen court found that the government was not misled to its detriment based on the inaccurate birth date, and the revelation of the petitioner's true age would not have prevented his entry to the U.S. 2007 WL 2156649 at *5. Similarly, the Petitioner here has not intentionally misled the government nor has he received any immigration benefit based on the incorrect birth date.

Furthermore, if his birth date is subsequently corrected in the Social Security

Administration's records, his eligibility for Social Security benefits will be delayed by three years.

26. Regarding the amount of time that had passed between the occurrence of the mistake and the filing of the petition, the <u>Kouanchao</u> court noted, "[a]Ithough it would have been preferable for [the petitioner] to have not made the mistake in the first place, or to have corrected the mistake at an earlier time, the passage of time does not bar his application." 358 F. Supp. 2d. at 839. There, as in the instant case, the government suffered no prejudice from the lapse of time. <u>Id</u>.

27. In another case with comparable facts, <u>Varghai v. Immigration and Naturalization</u>

Service, a citizen originally from Iran sought correction of his date of birth on his certificate of naturalization after the original mistake originated from a translation error by government officials in his home country. <u>Varghai</u>, 932 F. Supp. at 1245. The government refused to correct his certificate of naturalization. <u>Id</u>.

28. The court held in favor of the petitioner, finding that his mistake "was not made with an improper motive or with the intent to commit fraud or misrepresentation." <u>Id.</u> at 1247; <u>see also Kouanchao</u>, 358 F. Supp. at 839 (finding no improper motive).

29. These facts are in line with the present case, where Petitioner had no fraudulent intent or improper motive in allowing the mistaken birth date to perpetuate. The mistaken birth date did not qualify him for any immigration benefit he would not have otherwise been eligible to receive. Petitioner's young age at the time the mistake occurred, together with the tumultuous state of affairs in his home country and his family's justifiable fear and sense of urgency in fleeing Vietnam, explain the reason for Petitioner's inability to correct the mistake when it occurred. The fact that his culture places little to no significance on age and birth dates, in contrast to cultural and social norms in the United States, explains why the error never concerned the Petitioner until now.

30. In Varghai, the court acknowledged that

individuals applying for citizenship, through their lack of understanding and inability to understand English, place great and, in fact, almost absolute reliance on the clerks and representatives of the Government ... the applicants are excited, ill at ease and sometimes puzzled, and this is understood for they are being given the greatest right and privilege which this Government can bestow on any person.

932 F. Supp. at 1247 (quoting <u>Petition of Garcia</u>, 65 F. Supp. 143 (W.D. Pa. 1946) (noting that "[a]) though the court was referring to U.S. government officials in its reasoning, the same can be said of Petitioner's faith in Iranian officials")).

31. This passage reflects one court's understanding of the challenges immigrants face in immigration and naturalization proceedings, and the great faith immigrants place in the officials handling their applications. This reasoning may apply even more poignantly to refugees, such as the Petitioner, who have already survived horrific ordeals in their own countries and are completely at the mercy of the humanitarian efforts of the U.S. government.

 Denial of Petitioner's request would be inequitable and unnecessary considering the facts.

No one wants gratuitously to impose upon naturalization proceedings that technical spirit which easily follows a literal application of so detailed a statute, and which results in vexatious disappointment, and in needless irritation, to a defenseless class of persons necessarily left to the guidance of officials, except in so far as the courts may mitigate the rigors of their interpretation.

Kouanchao, 358 F. Supp. 2d at 838 (internal citations omitted).

Conclusion

33. Based on the foregoing, Petitioner requests this Court order an amendment of his certificate of naturalization to reflect his true birth date. Petitioner has provided unequivocal evidence of his true birth date in the form of a certified birth certificate and certified school records, with certified translations, and has shown good cause for such an amendment, with no resulting prejudice to the U.S. government.



WHEREFORE, Petitioner respectfully requests this Court:

A. Order U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services to issue a Certificate of Naturalization which will indicate that Petitioner's correct date of birth is [redacted].



B. Grant such further relief in Petitioner's favor as the Court deems reasonable and equitable.







individual subject to a detainer, and every time DHS takes an individual into custody in a courthouse

We write to provide you with advance notice that we are about to promulgate the attached policy entitled "Policy and Procedures Regarding Interactions with the Department of Homeland Security (DHS)." This policy is intended to go into effect on November 13, 2017. This document seeks to provide guidance to all courthouse staff including judges, clerks, security and probation officers in responding to DHS requests and the presence of DHS officials in our courthouses. Further, this policy is intended to comply with the decision of the Supreme Judicial Court in Commonwealth vs. Lunn & Another.

We recognize and respect your role as enforcement officers and we expect that you understand that the judiciary has an obligation to provide justice to everyone in this Commonwealth, whether they be citizens or not.

We remain available to meet with you to discuss this policy or any issues that relate to the presence of ICE in the Massachusetts courts.

Policy and Procedures Regarding Courthouse Interactions With the Department of Homeland Security

I. PURPOSE AND PRINCIPLES

The following policy governs the manner in which trial court employees, and in particular, court officers, shall respond to requests from the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) to provide information about, and take custody of, individuals subject to civil immigration detainers. It also governs how Trial Court staff shall respond when officials from the D H S enter a Massachusetts courthouse with the intent of taking custody of an individual subject to a civil immigration detainer.

Trial Court employees should be mindful that courthouses are public spaces that are open to all persons and that all persons entering a courthouse should be treated with respect and dignity, including individuals subject to civil immigration detainers and DHS employees. Trial Court employees play essential roles in ensuring the orderly administration of justice and providing a safe and secure environment inside the courthouse.

Nothing in this policy shall be construed to restrict compliance with 8 U. S. C. § 1373 (current edition) or to limit or abrogate: a court officer's authority to detain an individual pursuant to G.L. c. 221, § 70A; an order of a judge; a warrant issued by a judge or clerk authorizing the arrest of an individual for a criminal offense; or a criminal detainer.

II. RESPONSE TO DHS REQUESTS

Individuals subject to a civil immigration detainer often arrive in custody at a courthouse accompanied by a DHS "Notice of Action" immigration detainer form (currently DHS Form I-247A) that requests court employees to voluntarily: 1) detain the individual subject to the detainer for up to 48 hours in order for DHS officials to arrive and take custody of the individual even though the individual would otherwise be released from the trial court's custody; 2) transmit information to DHS regarding the individual subject to the detainer; 3) serve the individual with a copy of the detainer form; 4) relay the detainer to any other law enforcement agency to which the court employee transfers custody of the individual; and 5) notify DHS in the event of the individual's death, hospitalization or transfer to another institution. The DHS detainer form frequently is accompanied by a civil immigration warrant (ICE Form I-205 and/or Form I-200) that is signed not by a judge or clerk, but by a DHS official. In addition, there may be instances in which DHS officials directly ask court personnel for information regarding an individual or an Individual's case.

Trial Court employees shall not hold any individual who would otherwise be entitled to release based solely on a civil immigration detainer or civil immigration warrant. Trial Court employees do not have authority to detain an individual based solely on a civil immigration detainer. Nor do Trial Court employees have the authority to comply with a civil warrant issued by a DHS official for the arrest of an individual based solely on a civil immigration violation. Trial Court employees shall not serve civil immigration detainers or civil immigration warrants. Individuals subject to civil immigration detainers or warrants shall be processed and handled in the same manner as all other individuals coming before the court. No person shall be held in custody for any shorter or longer period than the person would otherwise be held based solely on a civil immigration detainer or civil immigration warrant.

Requests by DHS officials for information regarding an individual or an individual's case, whether made in a civil immigration detainer or made directly to court personnel, shall be treated by court employees in the same manner as would a request for information from any other member of the public.

If a DHS official requests information from a court officer regarding the status of an individual's case, the court officer may direct the DHS official to the appropriate clerk's office.

If a DHS official requests information from the clerk's office regarding an individual's case, or any case file, the scope of the responding employee's response shall be guided by the same statutes, rules, and policies that govern public access to court records.

If a DHS official requests information from Probation, the Probation employee shall direct the request to the attention of the Probation Legal Unit to be processed in the normal course.

III. DHS OFFICIALS TAKING CUSTODY OF INDIVIDUALS AT A COURTHOUSE

Although DHS officials are permitted to act in the performance of their official duties in Massachusetts courthouses, it is essential to the fair administration of justice that members of the community are provided a safe and secure environment when they enter the courthouse. To that end, DHS officials may enter a courthouse and perform their official duties provided that their conduct in no way disrupts or delays court operations, or compromises court safety or decorum.

In accordance with existing policy, armed law enforcement officers may enter a courthouse while in the performance of official duties. As applicable to all law enforcement officers, when an armed DHS official enters a courthouse, courthouse security personnel shall ask the DHS official to state his or her official law enforcement purpose for entering the courthouse and the proposed enforcement action to be taken, if any. The DHS official's information shall immediately be transmitted to a security supervisor or designated court officer.

The security supervisor or designated officer shall inform the first justice, or regional administrative justice of the department with jurisdiction over the person if DHS officials are present in the courthouse with the intent of arresting or taking anyone into custody, i.e. a party or other participant in a case before a judge or magistrate, or a person attending to business in the courthouse.

A. Individuals over whom the Trial Court has custody

Consistent with Chapter 2, sections XIV and XV of the Court Officer Manual (current edition), when an individual who was brought into court in custody is subject to release after his or her court proceeding, court security personnel shall process that individual out of lock up in the normal course regardless of whether the individual is subject to a civil immigration detainer or warrant.

If, during the processing of an individual subject to release out of the courthouse, a DHS official is present in the courthouse and seeks admission into the courthouse's holding cell area in order to take custody of the individual pursuant to an immigration detainer or warrant, court officers shall permit the DHS official(s) to enter the holding cell area in order to take custody of the individual once Trial Court security personnel have finished processing that individual out of the court security personnel's custody.

if a security department supervisor determines that the DHS official would otherwise take custody of the individual inside or immediately outside of the courthouse.

Before being granted entry into the holding cell area, DHS officials must present credentials and a copy of the detainer or civil immigration arrest warrant to court security personnel, sign in to the holding cell area, and surrender their weapons.

To the extent possible, court security personnel should require that DHS officials transport any individuals taken into custody through the prisoner transport entrance and avoid taking the individual through the public areas of the courthouse.

B. Individuals coming to court who are not in the custody of the trial court

In those instances where DHS officials seek to take custody in a courthouse of an individual who is not in custody of the courthouse security personnel, Trial Court employees shall neither impede DHS officials from doing so nor assist in the physical act of taking that individual into custody. In the event that court security personnel are present as DHS officials place an individual in custody in a courthouse, the role of such court personnel is to take those actions necessary to maintain the safety and decorum in the courthouse.

Nonpublic spaces in a courthouse, such as within clerks' offices or Probation offices, may not be used by DHS officials. No DHS official shall be permitted to take an individual into custody pursuant to a civil immigration detainer or warrant in a courtroom, unless permission has been given in advance by the regional administrative judge or first justice sitting in the courthouse.

IV. RECORDING INTERACTIONS WITH DHS

Court security personnel shall keep a log of every individual over whom the court accepts custody and who is subject to a civil immigration detainer or warrant, if known. Court security staff shall likewise keep a log of every instance in which DHS was notified that a person subject to a detainer was released from court custody, as well as every time DHS takes an individual into custody in a courthouse.

In addition, court security personnel shall draft an incident report for every instance in which DHS takes an individual into custody in a courthouse.
