I. Inmate Canteen Services

The Plymouth County Sheriff's Department has authorized the operation of a canteen service.

- Inmates may purchase from an approved list, items that are not provided by the facility.
- B. Inmates must have funds available in their accounts to make purchases, except inmates declared indigent may have certain approved items issued.
- C. A system to identify all non-perishable canteen purchased items accrued throughout the inmate's incarceration will be established.

II.

Canteen Services are provided by a vendor, operating under a contract with the Department.

III. List of Authorized Items

- A. Inmates are informed of canteen policy and procedure during the orientation process.
- B. Inmates will be limited in the amounts of items they are allowed to maintain for retention.
 - Restrictions on amounts may be determined by disciplinary action, but will not be punitive in their assignment.

IV. Administrative Services

- A. Weekly reports of sales by the canteen vendor are compared and reconciled with the inmate's account activity;
- B. Canteen vendor invoices are accurate before payment is approved;
- Quarterly commission checks are received in the proper amounts from the vendor;
- D. Records are audited in accordance with Sheriff's Department policy and procedures.
- E. Canteen funds are audited independently following standard accounting procedures, and an annual financial status report is available as a public document

V. Applicability

This policy applies to all department employees and inmates.

VI. Responsible Staff

The Superintendent will be responsible for implementing and monitoring this policy.
