### Vendor-specific Updates

- Karen Coye, FTG, reported on recent projects.
  - o As of December 20, FTG completed the last of the UPS firmware updates.
  - o FTG reported having a deeper level of access to the network now.
  - A meeting between Interisle and FTG engineers has been rescheduled for January 12.
  - o FTG is tracking questions and answers and will submit a report to the committee.
- Colin Strutt, Interisle, reported on recent projects.
  - Last week Interisle met with Boston Department of Innovation and Technology (DoIT) staff to discuss PSnet and BoNet connections.
  - o Meeting was productive; subsequent meetings will be held quarterly to touch base.
- Eric Johnson, Lan-Tel, reported on recent projects.
  - o Lan-Tel has finished the Boston Police Department (BPD) upgrade.
  - Regarding a Chelsea backhaul project, a tower holding six cameras is coming down.
    Lan-Tel is establishing a new path back to the Chelsea Soldier's Home.

## **Identify Needs and Next Steps**

- Equipment Needs
  - There is approximately \$15,000 available from FY15 funds to be applied to critical equipment needs. A discussion followed to determine the current need.
  - It was asked whether there are any locations within PSnet that have multiple small UPS's that may benefit from a larger unit. It was also asked whether there was a need for more spare switches.

ACTION ITEM: Interisle to look into both questions and report back.

o It was decided that if a vendor encounters an equipment need, the vendor is to contact Scott Wilder, PSNEC co-chair, and at his discretion he will begin the purchasing process through Boston OEM, consulting Michael Kiely, Somerville PD, and Harold Cataldo, Boston PD, as needed. If there is disagreement or further concern at any point in the process, Scott Wilder will bring the issue to the PSNEC for discussion.
