This letter is in response to your request. Please see the
attached records responsive to your request. The records were provided
with some redaction. The following exemption was applied under
Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 4 Section 7 paragraph 26,

(c)Personnel and medical files or information; also any
materials or data relating to a specifically named individual, the
disclosure of which may constitute an unwarranted invasion of privacy:

We do not have documents responsive to your bullets: 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7 as we have no agreements or potential agreements with any facial software recognition providers.

A requestor has the right of appeal to the supervisor of records under subsection (a) of section IOA and the right to seek judicial review of an unfavorable decision by commencing a civil action in the superior court under subsection (c) of section 10A.
