COPLINK Training

The Gardner Police Department will be hosting COPLINK training on November 6, 2019 from 8:30am - 9:30 am. Coplink is free statewide database integration and access for law enforcement to gather and view police reports. You will also be able to do photo arrays and use facial recognition to identify suspects. COPLINK is a valuable tool because instead of checking people by BOP you will be able to see police involvements whether they are a victim, witness, suspect etc. Currently 280 cities and towns across the Commonwealth contribute to and use this free service provided by the State Police Fusion Center. It is free for you to use. The technology has developed and advanced greatly over the past few years and now includes facial recognition. As it is designed for both, the Detective Division, patrol and Dispatchers will benefit in its use. COPLINK also has a mobile app that you will be taught how to use. THIS TRAINING WILL BE HELD AT THE GARDNER POLICE DEPARTMENT, The training will take about one hour and is free. Coplink User Training**

Coplink is a data sharing and crime analytics platform designed to aggregate records from disparate sources into a single, centralized, searchable database. More than 250 Massachusetts agencies contribute records to Coplink, including but not limited to: the Massachusetts Registry of Motor Vehicles (RMV), Board of Probation (BOP), Department of Corrections (MA DOC), Sex Offender Registry Board (SORB), as well as numerous local police and state police agencies.

Coplink allows users to quickly and easily view all records related to an entity. Users can perform complex queries, utilize wildcard searches, and identify associations or commonalities between two or more entities. Users may search by multiple demographic characteristics including scars, marks, tattoos, aliases, or identification numbers (SSN/SID/FBI/OLN). Photo lineups can be generated based on demographic characteristics and/or facial similarities.

Personnel from more than 300 agencies across the state have access to more than 20,000,000 documents and booking photos through Coplink.
