The Massachusetts Department of State Police ("Department") has received your request for records relating to "the MSP decision to discontinue the use of FaceMatch feature in Coplink" dated June 10, 2020. After a search of records, the Department does not have any records responsive to your request.

Pursuant to our previous email correspondence, the Department is providing you with a sample of 10 emails that were produced from the email search you requested which was conducted by the Executive Office of Technology Services and Security (EOTSS). Please note that none of the emails resulting from the search were responsive to your request as they did not "discuss the decision and the reasons to stop using the FaceMatch feature in Coplink."
