# 1. <u>Audit: ICE financial systems had year-long access control vulnerability</u>

Even though U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement took corrective action last year to improve its IT controls, a recent audit (<u>pdf</u>) found the agency still has major deficiencies regarding access controls and configuration management of its financial system.

The audit found seven deficiencies, two of which were repeat findings. The most significant weaknesses, from the auditors' perspective, were missing user authorization documentation and improper approvals of access.

Worryingly, the improper approvals of access was a repeat finding, meaning the agency has been operating for a year with a known issue in its financial security.

"In recent years, we have noted that limitations in ICE's financial system's functionality may be inhibiting ICE's ability to implement and maintain effective internal control and to effectively and efficiently process and report financial data," the Department of Homeland Security's Office of the Inspector General wrote in the summary of the audit's findings.

The audit also found that a configuration management plan had not been formally documented and that the financial system allowed obligations to be posted at a future date and processed receipts to exceed available funding.

To fix the agency's IT control deficiencies, the audit recommended that ICE:

- Update the User Account Management plan according to current processes, ensure that user controls are in compliance with that plan and document the steps taken
- · Review and update the User Management Plan
- Develop and strengthen controls around access authorization and annual recertification of users
- · Complete and document a configuration management plan
- Update system configurations to prevent obligations from being posted at a future date, thus ensuring that all processed receipts fall within available funding

In addition to the IT control deficiencies, the auditors also investigated two non-technical information security issues. These examined the agency's susceptibility to social engineering and the security of sensitive material in agency workplaces.

To assess social engineering vulnerability, the auditing organization, KPMG, called 45 employees and contractors to try to solicit password information. The organization reached 10 individuals, two of whom revealed sensitive information.

KPMG also randomly inspected 84 workplaces to spot unattended sensitive materials. It found 34 such workspaces that contained unsecured laptops, system passwords or access credentials and information marked for official use only lying in plain sight.

These security awareness issues were a repeat finding, and such workplace practices violate DHS policy, according to the audit. It should be noted, however, that KPMG conducted neither of these tests statistically or scientifically, so their findings may not be applicable to the agency as a whole.

The audit did not include the agency's response, and at time of publishing, ICE had <u>not released one on its website</u>, so we don't know whether it concurred with the audit's recommendations.

#### 2. GAO: FEMA suffers from weak IT management

The Federal Emergency Management Agency, or FEMA, must address management weaknesses in its information technology systems, an audit found.

Specifically, to ensure that its IT programs can support FEMA's ability to respond to disasters, the agency must improve governance and oversight of IT investments, modernize its IT environment and establish timeframes for addressing workforce planning and skill gaps, according to a recent report (pdf) by the Government Accountability Office.

IT is critical to FEMA's ability to provide help at times of need. With about 5,000

full-time employees, 10 regional offices, two area offices, five recovery offices and 3,700 standby disaster assistance workers, the agency needs to make sure these people and places have access to critical information and the ability to share it. According to FEMA's IT investment portfolio for fiscal 2015, the agency spent at least \$366.4 million for its IT investments.

FEMA has taken steps toward improving its IT. For instance, in 2014 it reestablished the IT Governance Board, which meets monthly to review the agency's infrastructure. But the board has not defined members' roles and responsibilities, and no formal process exists for regional administrators to provide updates, GAO said.

Additionally, although FEMA has strategic planning efforts in place for modernizing IT, which suffers from problems such as duplication and inefficiency, the plan is "not current and not yet complete," GAO said. For instance, the plan has not been updated since 2013.

FEMA's chief information officer "explained that updating the current strategic plan had not been a priority and the agency would rather spend resources on developing a new plan that incorporates a global FEMA IT strategic vision," according to the report. "However, a date by which a revised plan will be completed has not been established."

What's more, GAO has been dogging FEMA about workforce planning efforts since 2007, but issues persist. The agency surveyed its workforce to determine which skill sets were already available and which were lacking, and results showed that the IT shop had a shortage of 150 full-time-equivalent positions.

Lastly, IT management controls, risk mitigation and maintenance of project plans and cost estimates were also subpar, GAO said.

To correct these problems, GAO recommended that FEMA:

- Define roles and responsibilities related to the IT Governance Board
- Define the scope, implementation strategy and schedule of its overall modernization plan
- Establish time frames for IT workforce planning

The Homeland Security Department, FEMA's parent organization, concurred with the recommendations.

GAO audited FEMA as a result of the Post-Katrina Emergency Management Reform Act of 2006, which required the agency's administrator and DHS' chief information officer to improve FEMA's IT systems.

IT problems have plagued FEMA for years. In 2009, for instance, GAO said the

agency faced coordination issues and technical challenges in developing and implementing the Integrated Public Alert and Warning System. In 2012, GAO said projects related to improving FEMA's Disaster Assistance Improvement Program website were delayed.

#### 3. White House to launch Al push with new workshop series

The White House is planning to hold four public workshops this summer to develop plans and spur dialog about the federal government's use of artificial intelligence technologies.

In a White House <u>blog post</u> announcing the workshops earlier this week, Deputy U.S. Chief Technology Officer Ed Felten described some of the potential use cases for AI in government, as well as some of the challenges.

"In education, AI has the potential to help teachers customize instruction for each student's needs. And, of course, AI plays a key role in self-driving vehicles, which have the potential to save thousands of lives, as well as in unmanned aircraft systems, which may transform global transportation, logistics systems and countless industries over the coming decades," Felten wrote.

The four planned workshops have partnerships with academic and non-profit organizations, and the discussions will feed into the development of a public report later this year, according to the blog. The workshops are:

- Legal and governance implications of AI, in Seattle, Wash., on May 24
- Al for social good, in Washington, D.C., on June 7
- Safety and control for AI, in Pittsburgh, Pa., on June 28
- The social and economic implications of AI technology in the near-term, in

NYC on July 7

The government's use of AI has been limited thus far, but there are planned uses for the tech in the president's <u>Precision Medicine Initiative</u> and the <u>Cancer</u> Moonshot Task Force.

The Obama administration's days are numbered, and the extent to which the next administration follows through with the president's IT initiatives is an open question.

However, the blog post did note that the Al push will convene a new subcommittee within the National Science and Technology Council – the Subcommittee on Machine Learning and Artificial Intelligence. That subcommittee will monitor advances in Al tech and coordinate federal activity in the space, as well as provide institutional memory for the government's Al plans.

"Between now and the end of the administration, the NSTC group will work to increase the use of Al and machine learning to improve the delivery of government services," explained Felten. "Such efforts may include empowering federal departments and agencies to run pilot projects evaluating new Al-driven approaches and government investment in research on how to use Al to make government services more effective."

# 4. <u>Kansas Gov. Brownback mulls signature of judicial transparency bill</u>

The Kansas state Senate passed a bill this week that would increase government transparency regarding judicial selections.

The bill, which has been sent to Gov. Sam Brownback's (R) desk, would require

the governor to disclose the names of applicants to the Kansas Court of Appeals, The Wichita Eagle reported.

The legislation was spurred by Brownback's refusal to release the names of applicants when he made appointments to the court in 2013 and 2015, the newspaper related.

The legislation would also subject the Kansas Supreme Court Nominating Commission, which selects nominees to the state Supreme Court, to the requirements of the Kansas open records and meeting law.

The commission is made up of four members appointed by the governor and five elected by the state's practicing attorneys. The bill would require the Kansas Supreme Court's clerk to provide a list of attorneys to the secretary of state's office prior to an election of attorney members.

"The more the public knows about the nominating process for the selection of judges and justices, the better off we are," said state Senate Vice President Jeff King (R-Independence), one of the bill's main supporters.

King said the bill will let the public know what the nominating commission's considerations are for selecting justices. Requiring the governor to release the names of Court of Appeals applicants will give the public insight into his decision-making, King added.

# 1. <u>DISA plans cloud-based enterprise software for better DoD collaboration</u>

Friday, May 20, 2016 | By Stephanie Kanowitz

The Defense Information Systems Agency is working to replace its successful enterprise email service with a cloud-based software as a service enterprise product.

DISA's Defense Enterprise Office Solution, or DEOS, is designed to facilitate communication and collaboration across the agency, building on the Defense Enterprise Email program, according to a May 18 <u>article</u> in General Dynamics Information Technology's GovTechWorks publication.

DEOS will include phone services, web and videoconferencing, chat, instant messaging, white boarding and desktop sharing in addition to email and calendar features, according to the article. DISA had planned to simply upgrade DEE, but officials reconsidered when 18 vendors came up with "bigger ideas," the article stated.

"We determined that we would have to re-scope the effort to include a more robust suite of collaboration tools," said Kristin Brown, an IT specialist at DISA's Enterprise Wide Services division, according to GovTechWorks.

DEOS will use commercial software delivered via a commercial cloud that could be SaaS housed in government facilities, commercial data centers or a combination of both, GovTechWorks reported.

To get separate software programs to work together, DISA will rely on infrastructure and SaaS technology. "DEOS will leverage various application programming interfaces to allow integration flexibility" across the Department of Defense, she added.

An example she offered is integrating with enterprise voice-over-IP to let DEOS "provide point-to-point voice and video through the backend of the current EVoIP infrastructure to allow video teleconferencing integration."

By going with a cloud solution, DISA is providing opportunities for a mobile workforce, an industry expert said in the article. DISA and DoD are testing mobile access plans and working on security protocols for cloud, and they should be

ready when DEOS is, the article stated.

About 1.7 million people use DEE, which is less than half DoD's workforce of 4.5 million. All of those users could potentially make use of DEOS. The Army, DEE's biggest user, plans to adopt DEOS once it transitions toward unified capabilities. the article stated.

The Air Force, a much smaller DEE user, said that although it's weighing options to increase collaboration and interoperability, it might not choose DEOS. according to the article. The Navy and Marine Corps don't use DEE but could still opt to use DEOS, the article added.

Brown said DISA hopes to award a DEOS contract in the fourth quarter of 2017.

#### 2. US lawmaker seeking answers following \$81M cyber heist of Bangladesh central bank

A heist of the Bangladeshi central bank may not have been of prime concern to U.S. stakeholders 20 years ago, but in the age of cyber heists – especially one involving \$81 million – a top U.S. lawmaker is eager for answers.

This is particularly true in the case of the February cyber heist, as authorization from the Federal Reserve Bank of New York appears to have played a role in the theft.

The heist began when unidentified hackers gained access to a Bangladeshi central bank officer's computer, according to a <u>report from Reuters</u>. With their newfound access, the hackers used the Society for Worldwide Interbank Financial Telecommunication, or SWIFT, messaging system to contact the New York Fed and request a transfer from the Bangladeshi bank's account there.

Most of the requested transfers were blocked, Reuters reported, but \$81 million was sent to a bank in the Philippines.

What happened after that is less clear. Some of the funds were moved to casinos, but much of the stolen money is still missing. The Philippine government is investigating, and its inquiry so far has helped recover \$15 million.

However, the investigation suffered due to the country's strict bank secrecy laws, according to Reuters, and a representative of the inquiry said it could take three to five months to return the rest to Bangladesh.

Furthermore, evidence regarding the identity of the hackers is lacking. John Gomes, Bangladesh ambassador to the Philippines, told a panel in that country that the hackers appeared to be in neither Philippines nor Bangladesh, but that he had no further information. One Philippine senator, Ralph Recto, suggested the hackers could have been in China, though naturally the Chinese government dismissed the idea, according to Reuters.

That investigation will likely continue for several months, but, in the meantime, U.S. Sen. Tom Carper (D-Del.), the ranking Democrat of the Senate Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee is looking for answers on the U.S. end. Carper is determined to find out if either the New York Fed or SWIFT could have taken measures to improve their cybersecurity and prevented the heist – as well as if U.S. banks could be susceptible to similar attack vectors.

"It is my understanding that there is no evidence of any attempt to penetrate Federal Reserve systems or that any Federal Reserve systems were compromised in connection with these recent incidents," Carper wrote in a <a href="https://doi.org/10.1007/jht/

"However, these cyberattacks raise important questions about the security of the SWIFT system and the ability of its members to prevent future attacks. Congress has a responsibility to continue to strengthen our nation's cybersecurity, including ensuring that the system used by our banks to engage in cross-border transactions is secure," he added.

In his letter, Carper asked targeted questions of both organizations. These

included asking SWIFT what the consequences were for members who don't follow security standards and the New York Fed whether it has helped foreign or domestic banks better lock down their SWIFT exchanges.

Carper requested responses to the questions and briefings with his staff by June 17.

# 3. <u>Interior ignores repeated attempts by OGIS to check on status of FOIA appeals</u>

The Department of Interior is ignoring the ombudsman Congress set up to mediate Freedom of Information Act requests, according to a recent letter (<u>pdf</u>) sent by the Office of Government Information Services to the department's Office of the Solicitor.

The department has ignored repeated requests for information about six pending appeals of FOIA request decisions, according to the letter obtained by the Sunlight Foundation.

"Over the last few months, OGIS has contacted the DOI Office of the Solicitor seeking information about the status – including a tracking number – of these appeals, but we have received no substantive response to these inquiries," read the letter from outgoing OGIS Director James Holzer to Edward Keable, deputy solicitor general law at the department.

"I would appreciate any assistance you can provide in obtaining appeal tracking numbers and status information for each of the appeals listed above," Holzer continued. At the same time, the director admitted that his office has "no investigatory or enforcement power, nor can we compel an agency to release documents."

In the Honest Leadership and Open Government Act of 2007, Congress set up OGIS as the ombudsman for FOIA requests, explained Alex Howard, senior analyst with the Sunlight Foundation, in a <u>blog post</u>.

"Not substantively responding to repeated requests from OGIS ... is effectively sticking a thumb in the eye of the ombudsman that Congress established to provide independent oversight and arbitration over public records requests. The department is showing disrespect for the law of the land, and it should stop," Howard opined.

#### 4. Illinois auditor general sued following alleged FOIA violations

Allegations of misspent campaign funds <u>have dogged</u> Illinois Auditor General Frank Mautino since the former state representative began the position on January 1, but now he is being sued for his alleged failure to turn over records related to said funds as part of Freedom of Information Act requests.

The lawsuit, filed earlier this week (<u>pdf</u>), came from Kirk Allen, co-founder of the Edgar County Watchdogs. That group has <u>previously targeted</u> Mautino over the campaign funds.

According to the lawsuit, Allen sent a Freedom of Information Act request on February 9 to the Office of Auditor General and Mautino requesting communications relating to the campaign records. He received an email from the office the following day saying it was mailing over files too large to send over the internet, which arrived on February 12.

However, according to Allen, the 5,500 pages of records contained on the disk

contained "nothing to do with the requested records."

Allen then sent a second FOIA request on February 14, to which the office sent an email with 10 attached documents on February 18. Again, Allen claimed that these didn't relate to his request. Moreover, he cited an affidavit from a one John Kraft, who had received records in an FOIA request that would have related to Allen's request.

"[T]he records Kraft received were in fact communications from a State Representative and the Defendant's response to those communications and dealt with Defendant Frank Mautino's campaign expenditures, which are clearly records subject to Plaintiff's FOIA request," the lawsuit stated.

The lawsuit charged Mautino with two counts of violating the Illinois Freedom of Information Act. However, Edgar County Watchdogs sounded a skeptical – some might even say cynical – note for the suit.

"Short of a criminal investigation and possible prosecution, which is unlikely to happen in this State, he will probably never face accountability. Pretty ironic for a person who is responsible for ensuring State employees are held accountable for wrongdoing," the group wrote.

Several states' FOIA laws have come under fire in recent weeks. Just this month, FierceGovernmentIT reported on issues with the FOIA laws in <u>Virginia</u>, <u>New Mexico</u> and <u>Arizona</u>.

However, it's unclear whether Allen has any issue with Illinois' FOIA process itself, or just the implementation of the law by Mautino's office.

Dear Commissioner Barbieri:

I am legal director with the ACLU of Massachusetts, and I am writing to ask whether your department is considering using body worn cameras. The ACLU of Massachusetts believes that, if used with appropriate policies, body worn cameras can substantially benefit both civilians and police officers.

I also want to extend a hand. If my office can be helpful as you consider whether to use body cameras, and the policies governing their use, we would welcome the opportunity to work with you. We have already had positive experiences discussing this issue with several Massachusetts cities and towns.

We believe any good policy should do three things. It has to govern what events the officers should record, what should be done with the video once it's created, and what the consequences should be when officers violate the rules. Enclosed you will find a copy of our model policy and some frequently asked questions. More information about our work on body cameras is on our website at www.aclum.org/cams.

# MODEL BODY-WORN CAMERA POLICY, ORDINANCE, OR BYLAW FOR MASSACHUSETTS POLICE DEPARTMENTS AND MUNICIPALITIES

#### June 23, 2016

In light of the increasingly widespread adoption of body-worn cameras in the United States, and in response to growing demand for model policies concerning body-worn cameras in Massachusetts, the ACLU of Massachusetts presents the following model for use as either a police policy or a municipal ordinance or bylaw. As this model demonstrates, and as the experience of cities and towns across America confirms, a good body-worn camera policy can improve public safety, enhance community-police relations, and protect privacy. The ACLU of Massachusetts is eager to work collaboratively on this issue with community members, police departments, public officials, and other stakeholders to meet local community needs and concerns.

#### **Section 1: Findings**

- (a) There is no objective record of most encounters between {Name of City/Town} Police Department officers and civilians, which can lead to divergent and subjective accounts of these encounters.
- (b) The tragic deaths of civilians in police encounters, including numerous people of color, have brought police practices and police-community relations to the forefront of national attention.
- (c) Equipping police officers with body cameras can, together with good policies, provide objective evidence of encounters between civilians and police officers without unduly infringing privacy.
- (d) Body camera programs reportedly have been piloted or implemented in major cities throughout the country, including Atlanta (GA), Austin (TX), Baltimore (MD), Charlotte (NC), Chicago (IL), Dallas (TX), Denver (CO), Detroit (MI), El Paso (TX), Ferguson (MI), Fort Worth (TX), Houston (TX), Indianapolis (IN), Las Vegas (NV), New Orleans (LA), New York (NY), Los Angeles (CA), Oakland (CA), Orlando (FL), Philadelphia (PA), Phoenix (AZ), San Antonio (TX), San Diego (CA), San Francisco (CA), San Jose (CA), Seattle (WA), and Washington (DC).
- (e) Localities that have kept data on their body camera programs, including Buncombe County (NC), Mesa (AZ), Oakland (CA), Orlando (FL), Paulsboro (NJ), Phoenix (AZ), Rialto (CA), and San Diego (CA) have reportedly experienced substantial declines in civilian complaints, use-of-force incidents, or both.
- (f) The experience of these cities indicates that, when done right, body camera programs can enhance police accountability, deter misconduct by officers and civilians alike, and support rather than undermine positive police-community relations.

Now, be it ordained that the {City/Town} of {Name of City/Town} Code be amended by adding the following ordinance:

Accordingly, the following Policy shall govern the use of body-worn cameras by the {Name of City/Town} Police Department:

#### Section 2: Purpose

The {Name of City/Town} Police Department (hereinafter "the Department") shall adopt the use of body cameras by police officers to: improve community relations; foster better accountability for the actions of its personnel; deter inappropriate conduct by police officers and by members of the public; capture digital audiovideo evidence for criminal, civil, and traffic-related court cases; be used as a training tool for officer safety and best practices; and assist in the assessment of contacts between officers and the public by reviewing procedures and interpersonal actions. All provisions laid out in this rule shall be reflected in all related rules and procedures of the Department.

This {Policy/Ordinance/Bylaw} is issued to provide officers and supervisors with guidelines for the use of body cameras; the management, retention, storage and retrieval of, and access to, recorded media captured by body cameras; the handling of evidence derived from body cameras; as well as sanctions for failing to abide by these provisions.

#### **Section 3: Definitions**

- (a) "Body camera" shall refer to a device worn by an officer that can record both audio and video of an interaction between an officer and a civilian.
- (b) "Civilian" or "member of the public" shall refer to any person who is not an on-duty police officer.
- (c) "Officer" shall refer to a sworn member of the Department.
- (d) "Subject" shall refer to any individual who appears on video footage recorded by a body camera, except those who appear only incidentally.

#### **Section 4: Use Protocols**

- (a) Only officers with the authority to conduct searches and make arrests shall be permitted to wear a body camera.
- (b) Before each shift, officers shall inspect and test their body cameras to verify that they are working properly and fully charged, and shall notify their supervisor of any problems.
- (c) Body cameras shall be worn openly in a prominent location on the officer's body, uniform, or clothing, and in a manner that maximizes the camera's ability to capture video footage of the officer's activities.
- (d) Body cameras shall not be used surreptitiously.
- (e) Both the video and audio recording functions of the body camera shall be activated whenever an officer is responding to a call for service or at the initiation of any other law enforcement or investigative encounter between an officer and a member of the public, except that when an immediate threat to the officer's life or safety makes activating the camera impossible or dangerous, the officer shall activate the camera at the first reasonable opportunity to do so. The body camera shall not be deactivated until the encounter has fully concluded and the officer leaves the scene.
- (f) As close to the start of the encounter as is reasonably possible, an officer who is wearing a body camera shall notify the subject(s) of the recording that they are being recorded by a body camera.
- (g) Notwithstanding the requirements of subsection (e):

- (1) Before entering a private residence without a warrant or in non-exigent circumstances, an officer shall ask the occupant if the occupant wants the officer to discontinue use of the officer's body camera. If the occupant responds affirmatively, the officer shall immediately discontinue use of the body camera;
- (2) When interacting with an apparent crime victim (e.g., a victim of domestic violence or sexual assault), an officer shall, as soon as practicable, ask the apparent crime victim if he or she wants the officer to discontinue use of the body camera. If the apparent crime victim responds affirmatively, the officer shall immediately discontinue use of the body camera; and
- (3) When interacting with a person seeking to anonymously report a crime or assist in an ongoing law enforcement investigation, an officer shall, as soon as practicable, ask the person seeking to remain anonymous if he or she wants the officer to discontinue use of the officer's body camera. If the person seeking to remain anonymous responds affirmatively, the officer shall immediately discontinue use of the body camera.
- (h) All law enforcement offers to discontinue the use of a body camera made under subsection (g), and the responses thereto, shall be recorded by the body camera before discontinuing its use.
- (i) Body cameras, as well as other devices that can record audio and video, shall not be used to gather intelligence information based in whole or in part on First Amendment-protected speech, associations, or religion, or to record activity that is unrelated to a response to a call for service or a law enforcement or investigative encounter between an officer and a member of the public.
- (j) Officers shall not activate a body camera while on the grounds of any public, private, charter, or parochial elementary or secondary school, except when responding to an imminent threat to life or health.
- (k) Body camera recordings shall not be viewed by supervisors for the sole purpose of searching for violations of department policy not specifically related to a complaint or investigation.

#### **Section 5: Retention and Access**

- (a) Body camera video footage shall be retained by the Department, or an authorized agent thereof, for six months from the date it was recorded; thereafter the footage shall be permanently deleted unless a longer retention period is required by law.
- (b) Notwithstanding the retention and deletion requirements in subsection (a):
  - (1) Video footage shall be automatically retained for no less than three years if the video footage captures images involving:
    - (A) Any use of force;
    - (B) Events leading up to and including an arrest for a felony-level offense, or events that constitute a felony-level offense; or
    - (C) An encounter about which a complaint has been registered by a subject of the video footage.

- (2) Body camera video footage shall also be retained for no less than three years if a longer retention period is requested by:
  - (A) The officer whose body camera recorded the video footage, if that officer reasonably asserts that the video footage has evidentiary or exculpatory value;
  - (B) Any officer who is a subject of the video footage, if that officer reasonably asserts that the video footage has evidentiary or exculpatory value;
  - (C) Any superior officer of an officer whose body camera recorded the video footage or who is a subject of the video footage, if that superior officer reasonably asserts that the video footage has evidentiary or exculpatory value;
  - (D) Any officer, if the video footage is being retained solely and exclusively for police training purposes, provided that such footage shall be redacted to obscure the identity of any civilian appearing therein;
  - (E) Any member of the public who is a subject of the video footage;
  - (F) Any parent or legal guardian of a minor who is a subject of the video footage; or
  - (G) A deceased subject's next of kin or legally authorized designee.
- (c) To effectuate subsections (b)(2)(E), (b)(2)(F) and (b)(2)(G), any member of the public who is a subject of video footage, the parent or legal guardian of a minor who is a subject of the video footage, or a deceased subject's next of kin or legally authorized designee, shall be permitted to review the specific video footage in which the subject appears in order to make a determination as to whether they will voluntarily request it be subject to a three-year retention period, and shall be entitled to a copy of the video footage upon request.
- (d) No officer shall review or receive an accounting of any body camera video footage before completing any required initial reports, statements, and interviews regarding the recorded event. After any required initial reports, statements, and interviews are completed, a supervisor may review footage when necessary to evaluate the merits of a complaint by a subject of the video footage or a specific allegation of misconduct.
- (e) Officers are prohibited from accessing, copying, or releasing body camera video footage except for official law enforcement purposes. All accessing, copying, or releasing of body camera video footage that is undertaken for official law enforcement purposes must be logged. Officers shall never use a camera phone or other secondary recording device to make a copy of a body camera video for any purpose.
- (f) Under no circumstance shall body camera video be subject, either in real time or after the footage is captured, to any automated analysis, or analysis of biometric indicators of any kind, including but not limited to iris or retina patterns or facial characteristics.
- (g) Video footage shall be subject to the public inspection requirements of the Massachusetts public records law (M.G.L. c.4 s. 7 cl. 26; M.G.L. c.66), but otherwise shall not be divulged or used by the Department for any commercial or other non-law enforcement purpose.
- (h) Video footage made public pursuant to a public records request or for another legitimate law enforcement purpose shall be redacted to obscure the identities of minor children, and to obscure the identities of other individuals when the release of the video footage would unreasonably, substantially, or seriously interfere with the individual's privacy.

(i) Where the Department authorizes a third party to act as its agent in maintaining body camera footage, the agent shall not be permitted to independently access, view, or alter any video footage, except to delete videos as required by law or agency retention policies.

#### **Section 6: Enforcement**

- (a) If any Department officer, employee or agent fails to comply with the requirements of Sections 4 or 5, or interferes with a body camera's ability to accurately capture video footage, then the following enforcement mechanisms shall apply unless exigent circumstances made compliance impossible:
  - (1) Appropriate disciplinary action shall be taken against the officer, employee, or agent.
  - (2) The Department shall support a rebuttable evidentiary presumption in favor of any criminal defendant or civil plaintiff who reasonably asserts that, due to the noncompliance or interference described in this subsection, body-camera footage favorable to that defendant or plaintiff was destroyed or not captured.
- (b) Body camera video footage recorded in contravention of this {Policy/Ordinance/Bylaw} or any other applicable law shall be immediately destroyed. The Department and its officers shall not seek to introduce improperly recorded video footage as evidence in any criminal or civil legal or administrative proceeding against a civilian.
- (c) Nothing in this {Policy/Ordinance/Bylaw} shall be read to contravene any laws governing the maintenance and destruction of evidence in criminal investigations and prosecutions.

#### Section 7: Effective Date

This {Policy/Ordinance/Bylaw} shall take effect on {Date}.



# Police Body-Worn Cameras: How to Do it Right in Massachusetts

#### The Problem

High-profile incidents in which police officers have harmed civilians—often people of color—have highlighted a need for increased police transparency and accountability. Allegations of police misconduct, whether accurate or unfounded, damage trust between police and civilians, and erode their ability to work together to protect communities.

Factual disputes are a crucial part of this problem. In some cases, such as the killing of Walter Scott in South Carolina, cameras have revealed police misconduct that might otherwise have gone unproved. Likewise, in Chicago, Officer Jason Van Dyke was charged with murdering Laquan McDonald only after dashboard camera footage revealed that McDonald did not lunge at police with a weapon, as Van Dyke had claimed.

In other cases, such as the killing of Angelo West in Roxbury, video has allayed community concerns about possible misconduct. In all cases, for both the community and the police, learning the facts is vitally important.

#### The Solution

To protect both law enforcement officers and community members, police should use body-worn cameras (BWCs) during interactions with the public and implement BWC policies that (1) reflect community participation; (2) protect privacy; and (3) ensure public accountability.

The evidence supporting this solution is clear. In Rialto, California, a BWC study found a 60% reduction in officer use of force and an 88% reduction in civilian complaints. iv In Orlando, Florida, a BWC study found a 53% reduction in use of force and a 65% reduction in civilian complaints. According to recent polls, 90% of Americans support BWCs for police, if and 95% of large police departments have either deployed BWCs or have committed to do so. vii

Although no Massachusetts agency has issued guidance on BWCs, the ACLU of Massachusetts has drafted a <u>model policy</u> reflecting the principles of participation, privacy, and public accountability.

#### 1. Participation

#### • Engage the community to assess local priorities.

Body-worn camera polices should be shaped and approved through a public process, allowing community stakeholders to address local concerns.

#### • Disclose policies and key footage to the public.

Community members have a right to know how the police use BWCs. Policies governing BWCs, as well as key footage, should be publicly available.

#### 2. Privacy

#### • Prohibit recording without notice and, in private spaces, without consent.

Police should notify people that they are being recorded, and BWCs should be turned off *at a civilian's request* in sensitive situations such as recording inside of homes or when interviewing sexual assault victims. Videos with highly private footage should not be released to the public.

#### Never surveil activists or use biometric analyses.

BWCs should not be used to gather information based on First Amendment-protected speech, association, or religion. Data from BWCs must not be used in any facial recognition system.

## • Promptly delete video that doesn't involve the use of force, a complaint, or a detention or arrest.

Body-worn camera video should be deleted in a matter of weeks unless a recording is flagged at the subject's request or because it documents the use of force, involves an encounter that is the subject of a complaint, or led to a detention or arrest.

#### 3. Public Accountability

#### • Limit officer discretion to turn off the cameras.

Body cameras don't advance accountability if police can turn them off any time they want. Officers should record when responding to a call for service or any investigative encounter. That includes stops, frisks, searches, arrests, consensual interviews and searches, enforcement actions of all kinds, and any encounter that becomes hostile or violent.

#### • Officers should write initial reports before viewing camera footage.

Letting officers preview videos of an incident before giving a statement undermines the credibility of their statements and the integrity of investigations.

#### • Discipline officers who violate policy.

An investigation spurred by Laquan McDonald's killing in Chicago found that 80% of dashcams in city patrol cars could not record sound due to "intentional destruction" or "officer error." To prevent this kind of behavior, officers who violate BWC policies must face sanctions.

# Frequently Asked Questions About Body-Worn Cameras in Massachusetts

The American Civil Liberties Union of Massachusetts (ACLUM) has drafted a <u>model policy</u> for bodyworn cameras (BWCs) in the Commonwealth. Below are answers to questions about how a BWC program would operate under that policy. Learn more at <u>aclum.org/cams</u>.

1) Why should cities and towns in Massachusetts have a BWC camera program?

BWCs protect both police officers and civilians, building trust between police departments and the communities they serve. In Rialto, California, a study found a 60% reduction in officer use of force and an 88% reduction in civilian complaints when BWCs were adopted. In Orlando, Florida, a BWC study found a 53% reduction in use of force and a 65% reduction in civilian complaints.

2) Do officers have to keep the cameras on at all times?

No. Under the ACLUM policy, officers will be required to activate BWCs only when they are responding to a call for service or initiating an investigative encounter, such as an interview, stop, frisk, or search of a member of the public.

3) Will undercover officers wear the cameras?

No. Because wearing cameras could risk the safety of undercover officers, the ACLUM policy does not require undercover officers to use them.

4) Does the use of body cameras violate the Massachusetts wiretap law?

No. The state wiretap law prohibits "secret" audio recording. Under the ACLUM policy, BWCs are worn in a visible location and cannot be used secretly.

5) What about people's right to privacy? Will police have cameras on when responding to residential calls? Won't BWCs discourage victims of domestic violence from contacting the police?

No. Under the ACLUM policy, officers must ask residents of a private home if they would prefer to have the camera turned off before entering the residence. Furthermore, officers must ask crime victims and people reporting crimes if they would like the cameras turned off. If they say "yes," officers must turn off the cameras immediately.

#### 6) Should officers be permitted to review BWC footage before writing reports?

Not before writing *initial* reports. Just as civilians are normally asked to give statements before viewing body camera or surveillance video, the ACLUM policy requires officers to write their initial reports before viewing BWC footage. This approach treats officers and civilians equally, assures that police reports will not be written to fit the video, and is fair to police officers by permitting them to revise their initial reports after viewing the video.

#### 7) Is police video subject to the public records law? What about privacy?

Footage will be available under the public records law, subject to existing exemptions, including those related to criminal investigations and protecting privacy. But under the ACLUM policy, footage must be redacted to hide an individual's identity if its release would interfere with their privacy.

#### 8) Who will store the data from the cameras?

Data from BWCs is usually stored by a third party. Under the ACLUM policy, the storage provider would not be allowed to view the footage.

#### 9) Is the cost of storing data prohibitive?

There are fees for data storage, but since BWCs have been shown to reduce officer use of force and civilian complaints, costs of their implementation should be offset by savings to the city from a reduction in lawsuits and other costs related to officer or civilian misconduct.

#### 10) Will BWCs be used to increase surveillance of the public?

The ACLUM policy states that BWC footage may not be used for surveillance.

#### 11) Can individual officers simply refuse to use body cameras? Will officers tamper with them?

No. Under the ACLUM policy, officers who tamper with or don't turn on their cameras will face disciplinary action. If an incident is not filmed because an officer didn't turn the camera on, police departments cannot argue in court that a defendant's description of events is false.

#### 12) Will BWCs create a health hazard for officers?

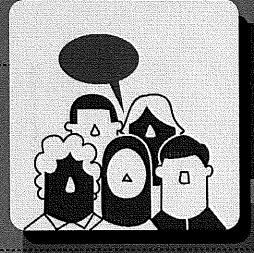
No. CB radios used by police don't create a health risk, and neither do BWCs. And unlike cell phones, which regularly transmit data through the air, BWCs record data which is downloaded after the officer's shift.

#### **AGENDA**

This two day (16 hour) course is designed for private and public sector investigators and analysts. Students with any level of familiarity with the Internet and computers, from beginning to advanced, will find this course beneficial.

The program gives students an up-to-date understanding of how social networking sites work and how members act and interact. Student will learn what information is available on various sites and how to integrate that information into criminal investigations and criminal intelligence analysis.

#### Session #1: Online Social Media: Tools, Tricks, and Techniques

Too often, investigators and analysts overlook or underutilize this valuable resource. Social networking sites are virtual communities. As in any large community, criminal organizations, fraud, violet crime, and victimization exist. Investigators need to understand these communities along with the tools, tricks, and techniques to prevent, track, and solve crimes.

Current trends include social networks based around live streaming video, like TinyChat and SnapChat, and mobile social networks like, Foursquare, Vibe, and Vine. These emergent technologies lead to risks and opportunities for law enforcement professionals that never previously existed. Current and future undercover officers must now face a world in which facial recognition and Internet caching make it possible to locate an online image posted years or decades before. The meshing of geolocation, metadata exploitation, social networking, and mobile devices allow officers to employ new investigative techniques not previously available.

#### Session #2: Facebook: Information Exploited

While there are over 1,000 social networking sites on the Internet, Facebook is by far the most populous, with over 1.1 billion profiles. It has a larger population as the US and UK combined, making it the third largest country by population. There are over 350 million images and 190 million status updates loaded on Facebook every day. This session will cover topics including Facebook security and account settings, Facebook data retention and interaction with law enforcement, and common fraud schemes involving Facebook. Recent additions and changes to Facebook, such as the Poke application for iOS devices, Graph Search, and Archive, make is more important than ever for investigators and analysts to fully understand this community.

#### Session #3: OSINT: Observation & Infiltration

Open source intelligence (OSINT) is a form of intelligence collection that involves finding, selecting, and acquiring information from publicly available sources and then analyzing it to produce actionable intelligence. Now that the Internet is dominated by Online Social Media, OSINT is a critical component of both criminal and national security investigations. Too often, investigators and analysts overlook or underutilize this valuable resource.

Attendees will explore the challenges that analysts and investigators face differentiating between observation and infiltration of predicated chatter. The advantages and disadvantages of various methods to conceal identities while engaging in online observation and infiltration will be discussed.

#### Session #4: Counterintelligence & Liabilities Involving Online Social Media

Current and future undercover officers must now face a world in which facial recognition and Internet caching make it possible to locate an online image posted years or decades before. The meshing of geolocation, social networking, and mobile devices allow officers to employ new investigative techniques not previously available. There are risks posed to those in the public arena, and those charged with protecting them, associated with online social media and online social networking. The online social networking activities of employees, along with ever-increasing availability of information in the online public domain, present real challenges to companies and governments.

#### Session #5: What Investigators Need to Know about Hiding on the Internet

Criminal investigators and analysts need to understand how people conceal their identity on the Internet. Technology may be neutral, but the ability to hide ones identity and location on the Internet can be both a challenge and an opportunity. Various methods of hiding ones identity and location while engaged in activates on the Internet, provides an opportunity for investigators to engage in covert online research while also providing a means for criminals to engage in surreptitious communication in furtherance of nefarious activities. As technologies, such as digital device fingerprinting, emerge as ways to attribute identity this becomes a topic about which every investigator and analyst must become familiar.

#### **AGENDA**

This two day (16 hour) course is designed for private and public sector investigators and analysts. Students with any level of familiarity with the Internet and computers, from beginning to advanced, will find this course beneficial.

The program gives students an up-to-date understanding of how social networking sites work and how members act and interact. Student will learn what information is available on various sites and how to integrate that information into criminal investigations and criminal intelligence analysis.

#### Session #1: Online Social Media: Tools, Tricks, and Techniques

Too often, investigators and analysts overlook or underutilize this valuable resource. Social networking sites are virtual communities. As in any large community, criminal organizations, fraud, violet crime, and victimization exist. Investigators need to understand these communities along with the tools, tricks, and techniques to prevent, track, and solve crimes.

Current trends include social networks based around live streaming video, like TinyChat and SnapChat, and mobile social networks like, Foursquare, Vibe, and Vine. These emergent technologies lead to risks and opportunities for law enforcement professionals that never previously existed. Current and future undercover officers must now face a world in which facial recognition and Internet caching make it possible to locate an online image posted years or decades before. The meshing of geolocation, metadata exploitation, social networking, and mobile devices allow officers to employ new investigative techniques not previously available.

#### Session #2: Facebook: Information Exploited

While there are over 1,000 social networking sites on the Internet, Facebook is by far the most populous, with over 1.1 billion profiles. It has a larger population as the US and UK combined, making it the third largest country by population. There are over 350 million images and 190 million status updates loaded on Facebook every day. This session will cover topics including Facebook security and account settings, Facebook data retention and interaction with law enforcement, and common fraud schemes involving Facebook. Recent additions and changes to Facebook, such as the Poke application for iOS devices, Graph Search, and Archive, make is more important than ever for investigators and analysts to fully understand this community.

#### Session #3: OSINT: Observation & Infiltration

Open source intelligence (OSINT) is a form of intelligence collection that involves finding, selecting, and acquiring information from publicly available sources and then analyzing it to produce actionable intelligence. Now that the Internet is dominated by Online Social Media, OSINT is a critical component of both criminal and national security investigations. Too often, investigators and analysts overlook or underutilize this valuable resource.

Attendees will explore the challenges that analysts and investigators face differentiating between observation and infiltration of predicated chatter. The advantages and disadvantages of various methods to conceal identities while engaging in online observation and infiltration will be discussed.

#### Session #4: Counterintelligence & Liabilities Involving Online Social Media

Current and future undercover officers must now face a world in which facial recognition and Internet caching make it possible to locate an online image posted years or decades before. The meshing of geolocation, social networking, and mobile devices allow officers to employ new investigative techniques not previously available. There are risks posed to those in the public arena, and those charged with protecting them, associated with online social media and online social networking. The online social networking activities of employees, along with ever-increasing availability of information in the online public domain, present real challenges to companies and governments.

### Session #5: What Investigators Need to Know about Hiding on the Internet

Criminal investigators and analysts need to understand how people conceal their identity on the Internet. Technology may be neutral, but the ability to hide ones identity and location on the Internet can be both a challenge and an opportunity. Various methods of hiding ones identity and location while engaged in activates on the Internet, provides an opportunity for investigators to engage in covert online research while also providing a means for criminals to engage in surreptitious communication in furtherance of nefarious activities. As technologies, such as digital device fingerprinting, emerge as ways to attribute identity this becomes a topic about which every investigator and analyst must become familiar.

Students receive course material, including legal process contact information, preservation letters, boilerplate compliance documents, and resource guides.
